PROJECT OVERVIEW

Tucked in the corner of Humboldt County, Orleans is a small hamlet alongside the Klamath River served by State Route 96 as it makes its way through Six Rivers National Forest. The highway, also known as Bigfoot Scenic Byway, serves as the main street for the small community.

The Orleans Community Enhancement project will beautify and improve safety in this historically underserved, low-income area by adding gateway monuments for each end of town, new crosswalk markings, and tribal art to represent the community. These improvements will create space to recognize the town and its history, as well as reduce litter and calm traffic.

Partners for this project include the Karuk Tribe Administration, Orleans Elementary School, residents, Humboldt County Association of Governments, and Orleans Karuk Med Clinic.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

1. Project begins: Summer 2021.
2. Construction: February - June 2023.
