### PROJECT OVERVIEW

This unattractive, paved area sits along State Route 255 and offers picturesque views of the Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge. Unfortunately, it has become a high-profile eyesore used for illegal dumping between the historically underserved communities of Manila and Samoa.

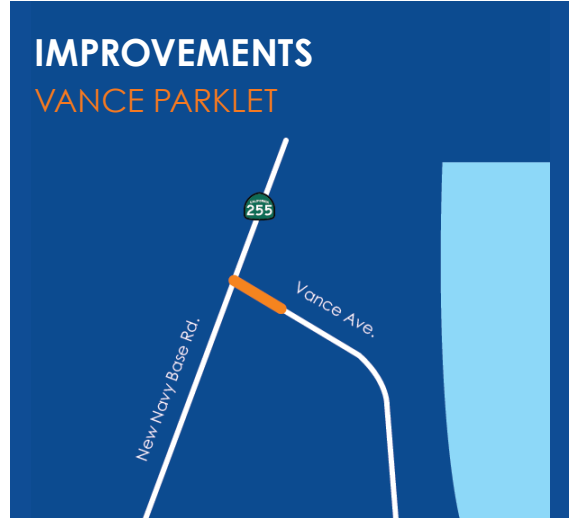
The Clean California project not only improves the views but adds value to this low-income area by creating a unique parklet that serves the community and creates recreational opportunities.

The Vance Parklet will offer a picnic area, benches for wildlife viewing, native plant beds, and designated parking spots. These additions will discourage illegal dumping and add a sense of community pride to a previously blighted area.

Partners for this project include residents, Humboldt County, Manila Community Services District, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife.
