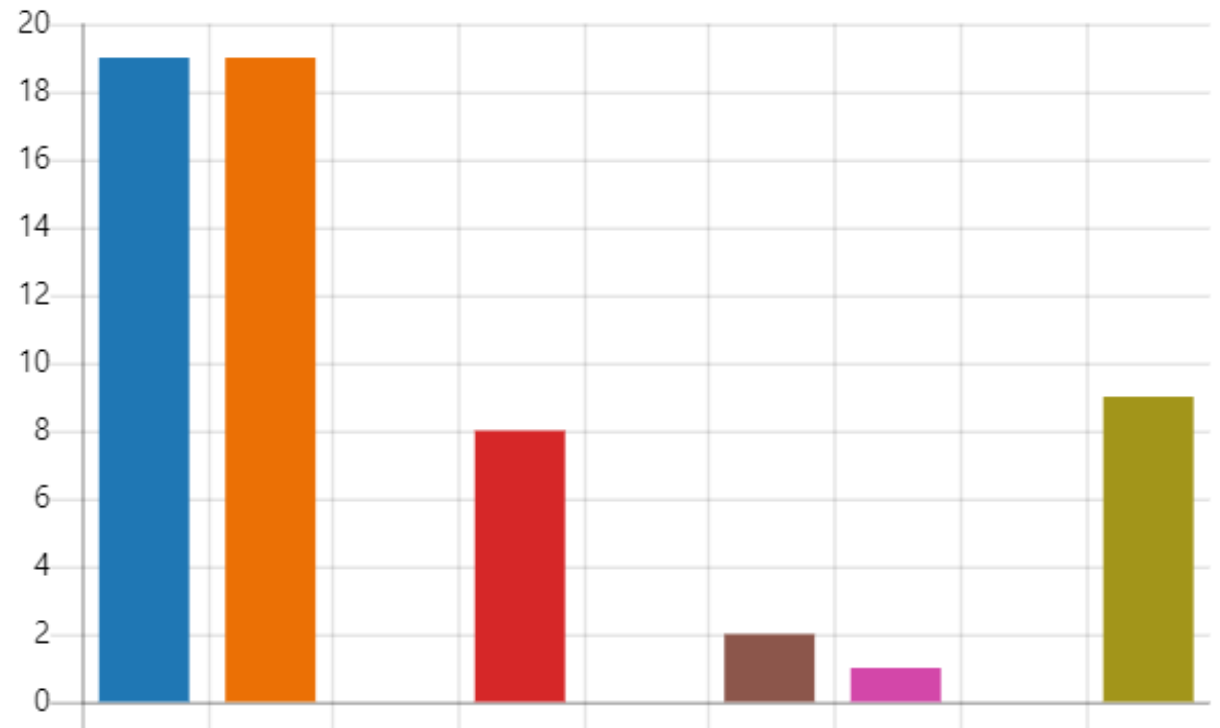

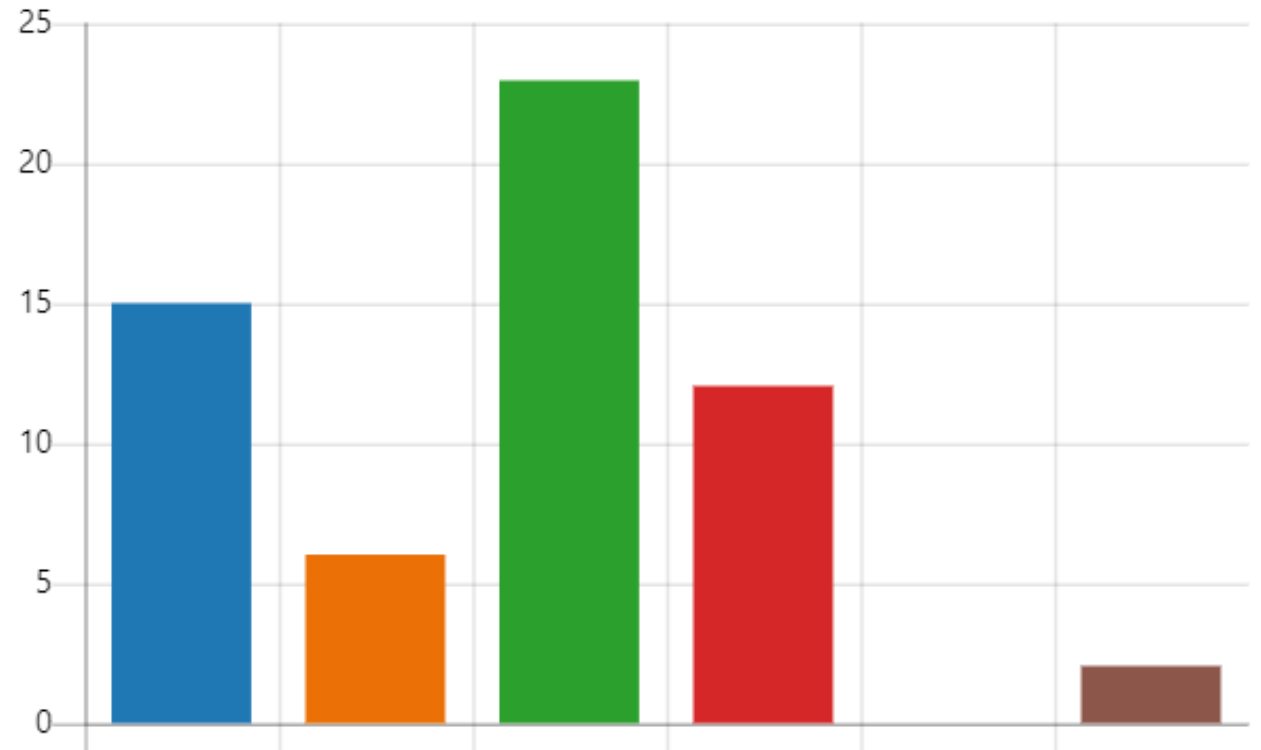
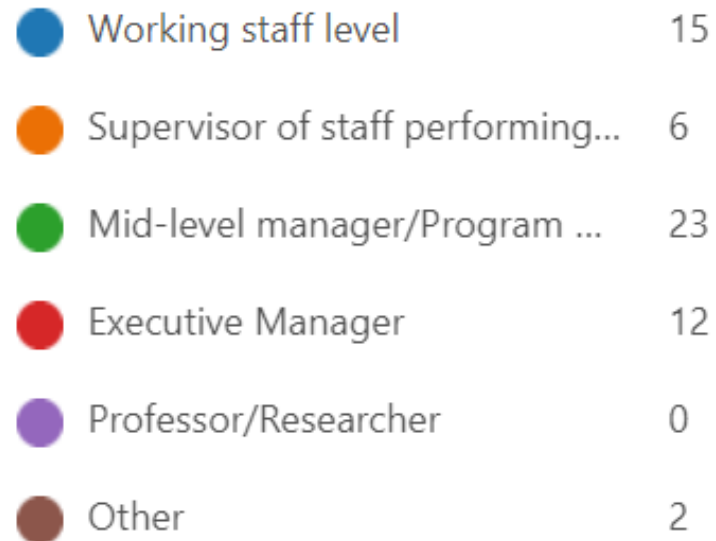
Which best describes the organization you represent?

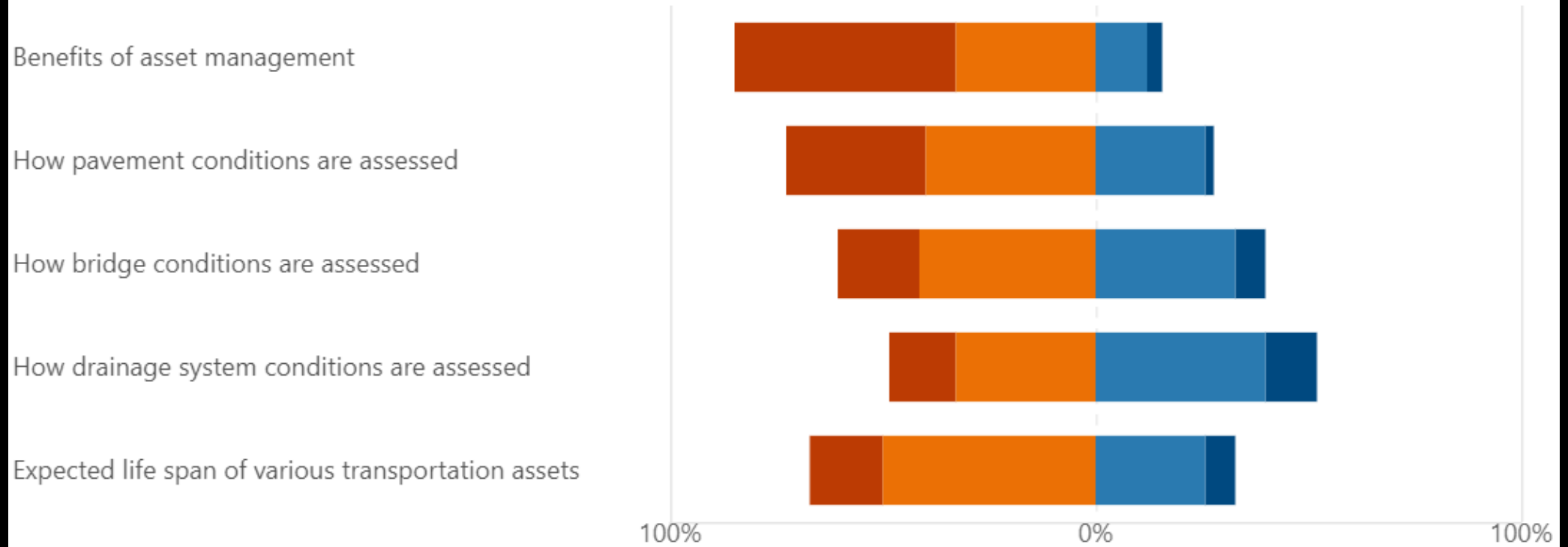
Which best describes your role in your organization

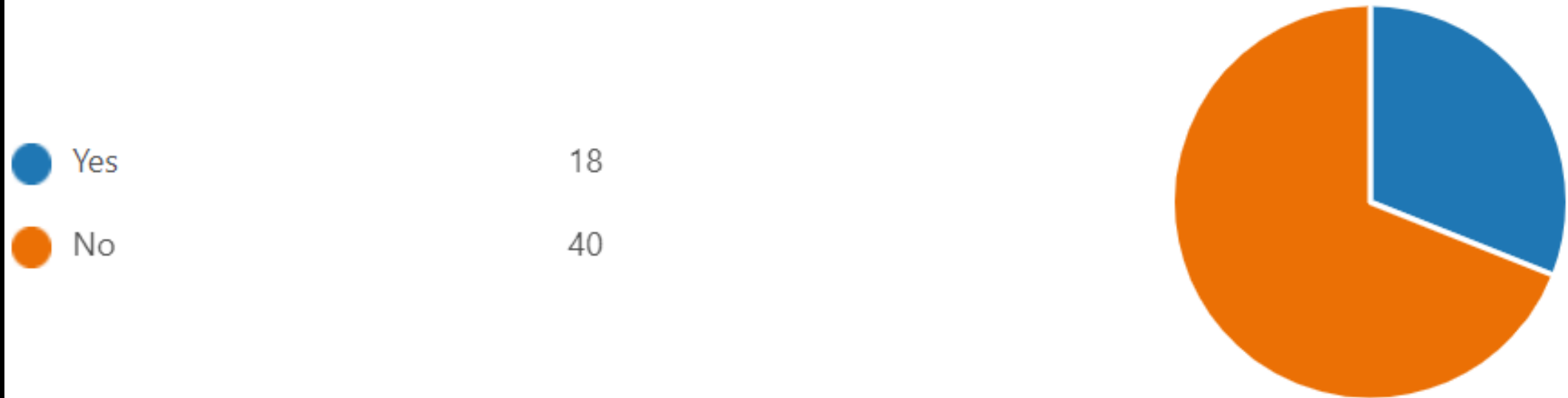
Does your agency use asset management software? (check all that apply)
