BENEFITS

As a state employee, you will be eligible for the following benefits. (Note: all benefits are subject to updates and changes according to bargaining unit agreements.)

Holidays

State employees receive paid holidays each year plus one personal (floating) holiday.

Vacation/Annual Leave

Vacation hours are earned depending upon time-base, bargaining unit agreement, and the length of State employment.

Sick Leave

Sick leave is a form of wage insurance that compensates employees during periods of absence due to personal illness or injury, or for the care of a sick or injured family member. The number of hours earned depends upon time- base and bargaining unit agreements.

Health

Numerous health insurance plans are available to employees and their dependents.

Dental

State employees and their eligible dependents are eligible for dental insurance available from one of several dental plans. The type of plan available is based upon your collective bargaining unit designation.

Vision

The Vision Care Program provides vision care coverage to employees and their eliqible dependents.

Public Employees' Retirement System

State employee pensions are administered by the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS). Most full-time employees, hired to work more than six months, are automatically members of CalPERS.

Savings Plus Program

The Savings Plus Program is a benefit enabling employees to save money to increase financial independence at retirement.

FlexElect Program

FlexElect is a voluntary program which offers eligible employees significant tax advantages and can increase take home pay.

THE ROLE OF HEAVY EQUIPMENT MECHANIC APPRENTICE

A Heavy Equipment Mechanic Apprentice, under close supervision as an indentured apprentice, performs progressively skilled work in the construction, repair and maintenance of heavy highway and automotive equipment.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES REQUIRED:

Knowledge of basic arithmetic and mechanical principles. Ability to read and write English at the level of instructional materials used in the apprenticeship program, including, but not limited to safety, operations and shop manuals; learn rapidly; follow directions, acquire acceptable work habits such as punctuality, skill, neatness, and dependability; apply mechanical principles; make satisfactory progress in the prescribed academic and practical work in an approved apprentice program for Heavy Equipment Mechanic.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

Willingness to improve knowledge and efficiency by completing related courses as directed

ORGANIZATION

The Division of Equipment has 12 shops located throughout the State and a Headquarters office in Sacramento. Positions for Apprentices to work in all 12 Districts, including Headquarters.
