

Forecast Summary

- Approximately 100 jobs are expected to be created in Del Norte County in 2019. Through 2024, employment growth is expected to be relatively flat, with the county neither gaining nor losing a substantial number of jobs.
- The largest gains are expected in healthcare and government. Together, these sectors will account for virtually all net job creation in the county between 2018 and 2024.
- Employment contractions are expected in construction, agriculture, information, and financial activities.
- The unemployment rate averaged 5.5 percent in 2018 and is near its lowest sustainable level. The unemployment rate may begin to rise during the 2018–2024 forecast period.
- The Del Norte County population is growing at a faster rate than the average for Northern California, but the countywide population will begin to decline during the forecast period.
- Housing production remains very low in Del Norte County and is not expected to increase meaningfully from current levels.

Job Growth

- Government is the largest employment sector in Del Norte County, accounting for 45 percent of all wage-and-salary jobs.
- Aside from government, the largest industries are retail, leisure and hospitality, and education and healthcare.







• After 2019, no meaningful job creation is expected in Del Norte County.

Government Employment

- Government agencies in Del Norte County gained a substantial number of jobs in 2018, and government agencies now employ more than 3,900 workers.
- Public schools and local municipal agencies accounted for virtually all of the job gains in 2018.
- The Del Norte County health department is among the largest agencies in the county, employing between 100 and 250 workers.






- The sheriff's department employs between 50 and 100 workers, and several schools employ at least 50 workers.
- The Yurok Tribe, an American Indian tribe located in Del Norte County, employs between 250 and 500 individuals who work for the tribe's government.
- Across Del Norte County government agencies and public schools, future employment gains will be determined by population growth and by the condition of state and local government budgets.

Retail Trade Employment

• Retail trade employment has fallen sharply since 2011 and is at its lowest level since at least 1990.




- Retail trade jobs have disappeared because local stores are facing increased competition from online retailers, and because the county's population is declining.
- The largest stores still operating in the county include:
 - The Walmart in Crescent City (100-250 workers)
 - The Home Depot in Crescent City (50-100 workers)
 - The Safeway in Crescent City (50-100 workers)
- During the forecast period, retail employment in Del Norte County is not expected to increase meaningfully because online competition will further erode brick-and-mortar jobs, and because the county population will continue to shrink.


Private Education and Healthcare Employment

- Healthcare agencies have generated 200 jobs over the last two years.
- The Del Norte County healthcare industry is dominated by Sutter Coast Hospital, which employs between 250 and 500 workers.
- The private education industry is very small, and neither gains nor loses a substantial number of jobs in a typical year.
- The number of healthcare jobs is expected to grow marginally during the 2018–2024 forecast period.

Leisure and Hospitality Employment

• The leisure and hospitality industry expanded by almost 200 jobs over the last eight years.








- The Del Norte County leisure sector is primarily concentrated in casinos, hotels, and restaurants.
- Hotels and casinos employ approximately 400 workers, while restaurants employ about 550 workers.
- The largest casinos are:
 - Elk Valley Casino (100-250 workers)
 - Lucky 7 Casino & Hotel (100-250 workers)
 - Redwood Hotel Casino (100-250 workers)
 - Tolowa Dee-Ni Nation Casino (100-250 workers)
- The leisure and hospitality sector is not expected to create a substantial number of jobs during the forecast period. This sector is a population-serving industry, and the Del Norte County population is expected to decline.


Population Growth

- The Del Norte County population increased sharply in 2018 after declining for almost a decade.
- Negative net migration (more residents moving out of the county than moving in) has been the primary contributor to population decline over the last decade, but in 2018 net migration turned positive.
- Deaths have also begun to outnumber births because Del Norte County has a large number of residents in the older age brackets.
- Over the forecast period, deaths will begin to outnumber births by a wider margin, creating a larger drag on population growth.











• The population may continue to increase in 2019 and 2020, but is expected to decline in the later years of the forecast period.

Unemployment and Inflation Rates

- The unemployment rate in Del Norte County was 5.5 percent in 2018, which is higher than the average for Northern California.
- The unemployment rate has reached its lowest sustainable levels and is expected to increase during the 2018–2024 forecast period.
- Inflation accelerated in 2018 as home prices and energy costs increased across California.
- In 2019 and 2020, inflation is expected to be within a range of 2.0 percent and 3.5 percent.







New Housing Production

- From 2013 to 2018, an average of 19 new units were built in Del Norte County each year. All were single-family homes.
- Between 2019 and 2024, an average of 20 to 25 homes are expected to be built each year, the majority of which will be single-family.

Income per Capita

- Income per capita was \$38,700 in 2018, which was below the Northern California average of \$46,200.
- Over the last six years, real income per capita increased at a rate of 2.2 percent per year.






• Over the next six years, real income per capita is expected to increase by an average of 1.8 percent per year.

Registered Vehicles

- There were approximately 27,600 registered vehicles in Del Norte County in 2018.
- By 2024, it is expected that the county will have 27,800 registered vehicles.



Public School Enrollment

- In Del Norte County, approximately 4,200 students were enrolled in K-12 public schools in 2018.
- By 2024, the county is expected to have 4,100 public K-12 students. Enrollment will decline because the population aged 5 to 17 will decline.
