

Forecast Summary

- Fewer than 50 jobs are expected to be created in Lassen County in 2019. Beginning in 2020, employment levels in Lassen County are expected to decline.
- Between 2018 and 2024, no sectors are expected to create a meaningful number of jobs, although some may expand slightly.
- The largest losses are expected in private education and healthcare, which is forecasted to lose between 20 and 30 jobs by 2024.
- The unemployment rate averaged 4.8 percent in 2018 and is near its lowest sustainable level. The unemployment rate will begin to rise during the 2018–2024 forecast period.
- The Lassen County population is contracting and will continue to do so.
- Housing production has been low in Lassen County, and is not expected to increase meaningfully during the forecast period.

Job Growth

 Between 2012 and 2018, employment levels in Lassen County declined by 0.3 percent per year. Between 2018 and 2024 they are expected to decline by 0.1 percent per year.







- The largest sector is government, but government is forecasted to generate only a small number of jobs through 2024.
- The other major sectors are retail and healthcare, and employment contractions are expected in both of these industries during the 2018–2024 forecast period.

Population Growth

 The Lassen County population is declining, and this decline is expected to persist for the foreseeable future.






- Net migration has been negative for the last decade, meaning that more people have moved out of the county than moved in.
- Net migration is expected to remain negative though 2024.
- The county has a relatively older population base, with a high share of residents in retirement age and a low share in the childbearing years.
- Sometime before the year 2030, the number of deaths is expected to exceed the number of births, contributing further to population decline.





- Government is the largest employment sector in the county, accounting for 61 percent of wage and salary jobs.
- There are a number of prominent government entities in the county, including:
 - Several state and federal correctional institutions
 - Sierra Army Depot (an Army base in Herlong)
 - · An Army National Guard site
 - The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection
 - · Lassen Community College
 - · Local public schools
- Government agencies in Lassen County downsized by almost 200 jobs between 2012 and 2018.
- Federal agencies shed approximately 150 jobs while state and local entities lost almost 50 jobs.
- Across Lassen County government agencies and public schools, future employment levels will be determined by population growth and by the condition of federal, state, and local government budgets.

Private Education and Healthcare Employment

Healthcare agencies have lost approximately 175 jobs since 2010.











- Banner Lassen Medical Center (100-250 workers)
- Northeastern Rural Health Clinics (100-250 workers)
- Lassen Nursing and Rehab Center (50–100 workers)
- The private education industry is very small, and neither gains nor loses a substantial number of jobs each year.
- The number of healthcare jobs is expected to decline further through 2024.

Retail Employment

- The retail sector gained more jobs between 2012 and 2018 than any other industry.
- Retail employment has grown in spite of the fact that the Lassen County population is declining.
- The largest prominent employers are Walmart, a handful of grocery stores, and a few hardware and clothing stores. All of these establishments are located in Susanville.






• Virtually no retail jobs are expected to be created through 2024.


Unemployment and Inflation Rates


- The unemployment rate in Lassen County was 4.8 percent in 2018, which is lower than the average for Northern California.
- The unemployment rate has reached its lowest sustainable level and is expected to increase during the 2018–2024 forecast period.
- Inflation accelerated in 2018 as home prices and energy costs increased across California.
- In 2019 and 2020, inflation is expected to be within a range of 2.0 percent and 3.5 percent.

New Housing Production

• From 2013 to 2018, an average of 10 new units were built in Lassen County each year.









 Homebuilding has been minimal, and will remain low, because the population continues to decline.

Income per Capita

- Income per capita was \$38,700 in 2018, which was below the Northern California average of \$46,200.
- Over the last six years, real income per capita increased at a rate of 2.0 percent per year.
- Over the next six years, real income per capita is expected to increase by an average of 1.4 percent per year.





Registered Vehicles

- There were approximately 35,900 registered vehicles in Lassen County in 2018.
- By 2024, it is expected that the county will have 35,600 registered vehicles.
- The number of registered vehicles will decline because the population will decline.

Public School Enrollment

- In Lassen County, approximately 4,200 students were enrolled in K-12 public schools in 2018.
- By 2024, the county is expected to have 4,300 public K-12 students.
- Despite a contraction of the overall population, the number of residents aged 5 to 17 is expected to increase, leading to higher school enrollments.
