

Forecast Summary


- Virtually no jobs are expected to be created in Sierra County in 2019. Over the entire 2018–2024 forecast period, Sierra County will neither gain nor lose a meaningful number of jobs.
- There are three major employment categories in Sierra County, which include goods producing firms, service providing firms, and government agencies. Job growth will be sparse in all three of these sectors.
- The unemployment rate averaged 6.0 percent in 2018 and is near its lowest sustainable level. The unemployment rate may begin to rise in 2019 or 2020.
- Between 2018 and 2024, the size of the county's population is expected to remain relatively unchanged.
- Housing production remains very low in Sierra County, and very few new homes will be built during the 2018–2024 forecast period.


Population Growth


- The Sierra County population has declined relatively consistently, falling from approximately 3,600 residents in the 1990s to 3,153 residents in 2018.
- Sierra County's population is much older than the statewide average. As of 2018, more than 13 percent of Sierra County's population was aged 75 or older, while just 6 percent of the California population was aged 75 or older.
- Because Sierra County has a high share of residents aged 75 and older, the number of deaths has begun to exceed the number of births.














- Between 2013 and 2018, there were 92 more deaths than births, which contributed to overall population decline.
- Between 2019 and 2024, the size of the population is expected to remain relatively constant. There are expected to be approximately 50 more deaths than births, but approximately 50 net migrants will enter the county, leading to virtually no population growth.


Job Growth


- The Sierra County job market is small and is not large enough to accommodate the local population.
- The region's primary job centers are outside of the county, and include the Tahoe-Truckee area to the South and the Reno-Sparks region just east of the Nevada State line.
- Cross-county commuting is common, and a high percent of job-related income is earned by local residents who hold jobs in other counties.













- Within Sierra County in 2018, the job market was comprised of:
 - 348 jobs in government agencies
 - 182 jobs in service providing firms
 - 26 jobs in good producing companies
- Between 2012 and 2018, approximately 75 non-farm jobs were lost in Sierra County.
- Between 2018 and 2024, the number of non-farm jobs is not expected to change substantially.

Unemployment and Inflation Rates

- The unemployment rate in Sierra County was 6.0 percent in 2018, which was above the average for the Sierra Nevada Region.
- The unemployment rate has reached its lowest sustainable level and may begin to rise in 2019 or 2020.







- Inflation accelerated in 2018 as home prices and energy costs increased across California.
- In 2019 and 2020, inflation is expected to be within a range of 2.0 percent and 3.5 percent.

New Housing Production

- From 2013 to 2018, a total of 37 new homes were built in Sierra County. All were single-family homes.
- No multifamily units have been built in the county since 1978.
- Between 2019 and 2024, approximately 20 to 30 homes are expected to be built and all will be single-family units.







Income per Capita

- Income per capita was \$44,300 in 2018, which was below the Sierra Nevada Region average of \$55,400.
- Over the last six years, real income per capita has risen at a rate of 1.2 percent per year.
- Over the next six years, real income per capita is also expected to increase by an average of 1.2 percent per year.

Registered Vehicles

- There were approximately 5,500 registered vehicles in Sierra County in 2018.
- By 2024, it is expected that the county will have 6,100 registered vehicles.





Public School Enrollment

- In Sierra County, approximately 400 students were enrolled in K-12 public schools in 2018.
- Enrollment levels have been declining since the 1990s when there were more than 800 students in Sierra County.
- Over the forecast period, enrollment levels will begin to increase because the population aged 5 to 17 will increase.
- By 2024, approximately 430 students are expected to be enrolled in the county.
