Caltrans and Impact Teen Drivers are working with student leaders to develop safe driving programs across California. Up to 10 California schools will be selected to participate in a Lead the Leaders traffic safety training program and to create an interactive on-campus event. The 10 schools that complete these activities and meet all the requirements will be in the running for a cash prize award:

1st Place \$2,000, 2nd Place \$1,000, 3rd Place \$500

Steps to Enter:

1. Use this application (or download it at BeWorkZoneAlert.com) and complete the requested information.
2. Obtain authorization from an administrator at your school for the activities and proposed date options. An original signature from an authorized administrator (School Principal, Vice Principal, Activity Director, etc.) must be included on the signature line under Participation Agreement to enter the competition.
3. Email the completed and signed application to schoolchallenge@beworkzonealert.com by **December 1, 2014**.*

* Applications to enter for the 2014/15 school year will be accepted between **September 12, 2014 and December 1, 2014**. Applications will be evaluated by a panel of judges and the top 10 schools selected to compete in the Distraction Zone School Challenge for the 2014/15 school year will be notified by **December 5, 2014**. The 10 schools selected to compete will then receive \$100 as well as a toolkit of campaign resources to help create their proposed program. An additional \$200 will be provided to your school once the on-campus event is complete and an Event Summary Report has been submitted. **Contest, funds for materials and prizes are provided by Clear Channel Media + Entertainment.**

This two-and-a-half-hour training program will give student leaders the tools and framework for developing and executing a successful peer-to-peer traffic safety advocacy project.

*Proposed dates must be between **December 8, 2014 and February 28, 2015**. If your school is selected as a contender in the Distraction Zone School Challenge, campaign representatives will be on-site for a required 2 ½ hour training and planning session for your student leadership group. Some event resources and instructions will also be provided.*

2. Commit to holding an on-campus Distraction Zone-themed traffic safety event.

Student leaders will be empowered by the Lead the Leaders training session to plan and execute an on-campus [Distraction Zone](#)-themed traffic safety event. The goal of the event is to engage the student body in traffic safety education messages, and encourage them to play the [Distraction Zone](#) safe driving game and enter the [Distraction Zone](#) contest. The Distraction Zone game offers fun and interactive game play while also teaching players about safe driving. If your school is selected as a contender in the Distraction Zone School Challenge, one or more campaign representatives will be on-site to evaluate the on-campus event or promotional activities.*



3. Outline a proposed plan for an on-campus Distraction Zone-themed traffic safety event.

Develop an outline describing the proposed Distraction Zone-themed traffic safety event and outreach activities that will be planned for your school. This outline detailing your proposed plan will be the primary focus in evaluating this application for your school to be selected as one of the 10 schools to compete in the Distraction Zone School Challenge. A panel of judges will evaluate your proposed plan based on the breadth, creativity and potential success of the proposed event or outreach activities.

The top 10 school applications judged to be the best will be notified by December 5, 2014 as the 10 schools selected to compete in the Distraction Zone School Challenge. The competing schools will receive \$100 up front for event materials and a toolkit of resources. After the successful execution of your on-campus event, you will be asked to submit an Event Summary Report. Once this report is submitted via email to: schoolchallenge@beworkzonealert.com (due by May 8, 2015), an additional \$200 will be provided to your school. The total of these funds (amounting to \$300) can be considered in your planning.

Elements to consider in your outline description could include:

- What time of day and where on campus it will be held.
- Approximately how many students will be able to participate.
- What types of activities will be offered.
- How it will be publicized to students, teachers, parents, etc.

How to Win

How Schools Selected to Compete will be Evaluated:

The following scoring criteria will be used to evaluate the 10 schools competing in the Distraction Zone School Challenge.

Evaluation Criteria*	Total Points Possible	Points Earned
1. Quality and effectiveness of Distraction Zone-themed on-campus event and traffic safety education outreach activities.	25	
2. Creative use of campaign resources and messages.	20	
3. Quality and creativity of unique materials created by students for your school program.	20	
4. Event Summary Report: quality of results achieved by school promotion.	15	
5. Percentage of enrolled students at school who played the Distraction Zone game and entered the Distraction Zone Contest by submitting their highest score. (The Distraction Zone contest entry form calls for players to identify their school name.) 0% = 0 points 1%-5% =5 points 6%-30%=10 points 31%-70%=15 points 71%-100%=20 points	20	
BONUS POINTS: Best Photo from the event.	5	
BONUS POINTS: Best PA announcement promoting safe driving and the Distraction Zone game.	5	
BONUS POINTS: Best student created PSA (video, audio, print, web) promoting safe driving messages and the Distraction Zone game.	10
