STATE ROUTE 198 NIGHT AND LANE CLOSURES FOR BRIDGE REHABILITATION PROJECT

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in cooperation with Granite Construction Inc. announces a scheduled night closure as part of a bridge rehabilitation project in Hanford within Kings County. This project will make safety enhancements to undercrossing bridges on State Route 198 at 11th Avenue and 14th Avenue.

The following night and lane closures are scheduled for next week:

Eastbound and Westbound State Route 198 at 11th Avenue will be reduced to one lane in each direction. This will be a 24 hour a day lane closure beginning, at 7:00 a.m. Monday morning, June 23rd thru 12:00 noon on Thursday, July 3rd, 2014.

FULL FREEWAY CLOSURE beginning Monday night, June 30th through Tuesday morning, July 1st, 2014 eastbound and westbound State Route 198 will be closed at 11th Avenue between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

During this closure, eastbound and westbound State Route 198 will be closed at 11th Avenue while crews are working. Eastbound traffic will be detoured off of State Route 198 at the 11th Avenue exit, continue onto 3rd Street (frontage road) and then back onto 198 just east of Douty Street. Westbound traffic will be detoured off of State Route 198 at the Redington Street exit, continue onto 4th Street (frontage road) and then back onto 198 at 11th Avenue. This closure will also include the on-ramp from Redington onto westbound State Route 198.

Flagging personnel will be on site to help direct traffic through the work zone. Commuters are reminded to obey flagging personnel and pay close attention to road construction vehicles and personnel.

Motorists may experience delays and are encouraged to take alternate routes whenever possible. Closures may continue for longer periods of time each night if necessary, due to delays caused by weather or uncontrollable events that may occur during construction.

Caltrans would like to thank the residents, businesses and commuters for their patience during this enhancement project. The public is asked to drive with extra care while traveling through the construction area and please **Slow of the Cone Zone**.
