

Widget Navigation



Component	Description
1	Click on the small globe in the widget to set the map extent to the maximum or full extent or basically to return it to statewide.
2	Clicking on or between any of the pointers around the small globe pans the viewer in the requested direction. <ul style="list-style-type: none">▶ Move Right◀ Move Left▲ Move Up▼ Move Down
3	This tool in the widget will take your map back to the previous extent that you were zoomed into if you have re-centered, zoomed in or zoomed out OR it will take your map forward to the next extent that you were zoomed into if you have re-centered, zoomed in or zoomed out and then gone back to a previous extent.
4	Click on this icon (+) to zoom the map in to the next level of detail.
5	Moving the slider up or down will zoom the map in or out to the next level of detail.
6	Click on this icon (-) to zoom the map out to the next level of detail.
7	Clicking on the hand icon will enable panning mode. Panning is enabled by default when the map viewer is initially launched.
8	Clicking on this icon will enable the zoom in tool. Hold and drag your left mouse button to draw a rectangle that defines the new extent that the map will zoom in to once you release the left mouse button.
9	Clicking on this icon will enable the zoom out tool. Hold and drag with your left mouse button to draw a rectangle that is subtracted from the current map extent and the difference is what the map will zoom out to once you release the left mouse button.

Keyboard Navigation

Navigating the map by using the keyboard is very effective. Zooming, panning, and other actions can be performed with a keystroke or combined keystroke and mouse action.

Panning the map can be done with the arrows keys on the keyboard. The UP arrow pans North, the DOWN arrow pans South, the RIGHT arrow pans East, and the LEFT arrow pans West.

Zooming in and out can be achieved by using the Shift key and either the "+" or the "-" key on a numeric keypad.

Another great way to zoom in is to hold down on the Shift key and then click and drag a rectangle on the map to define the zoom area.

Zooming back out to full extent or a statewide view can be done by pressing the Shift key and then "f".

Mouse Navigation

Navigating the map can also be done with a mouse.

To zoom in, scroll the mouse wheel forward or up.

To zoom out, scroll the mouse wheel backward or down.

Hold the Shift key down, then hold the left mouse button down and drag to draw a rectangle. The map will zoom in to the area of the rectangle.

You can also zoom out by holding the Ctrl key down, then double-click the left mouse.
