Due to the 2015 drought conditions that everyone is experiencing, MID has no surface water in our system. We cannot predict what MID's 2016 Irrigation Season will hold forth at this early date. Your contractor will need to contact MID closer to 2016 Bridge Maintenance Projects to see if we can assist them. There is a MID permitting process to access our surface water, if available, for non irrigation purposes, such as, dust control and compaction.

I am the contact person for The MID Non Irrigation Water Use Permit. Your contractor may contact me when these maintenance projects become active. I will let them know if MID water is available or not.

Hello Mr. Porter,

My name is Jhoanna Oamilda and I work for Caltrans District 10 in Stockton.

I am writing in regards to finding construction water sources for our upcoming 2016 Maintenance Bridge Project in Merced County, on Route 99 in Merced between Child Avenue and Franklin Road.

10-1E2704; Mer-99-13.1/R36.7

As part of our efforts to conserve water in the State, we have been directed to provide in each of our projects a non-potable water source in an information handout as part of our projects PS&E packages.

This means that as the designer we need to check during design stage for a readily available non-potable water source first and if not possible, then a potable water source that the contractor can select to use during construction. I have included a copy of our Caltrans Directive and Water Usage Guidance.

Does Merced Irrigation District have either non-potable and potable water available that could be listed as a potential water source for this construction project (10-1E2701) in Merced area?

We understand that if a source is available, the awarded contractor would need to contact Merced Irrigation District to apply for a temporary construction permit prior to the start of construction and pay any applicable permit fee if they choose this source.

If you could please email me back or call me to let me know if you do have a source or any additional information on the process, I would greatly appreciate it. Once I hear back from you I will include this information in my PS&E Package.
