- STIP Amendment ~~98S-157~~ **00S-001** - Action Transfers ~~\$3,500,000~~ **\$3,000,000** of Interregional Improvement Program (IIP) funds from the final phase (Phase III) to the interim phase (Phase II) of the Route 680 Sunol Grade Southbound High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane project in Alameda and Santa Clara counties.
