ROUTES 5 AND 113 IN YOLO COUNTY

RECOMMENDATION

The Department recommends the California Transportation Commission, as a responsible agency, consider the Negative Declaration for a project before approving funds for the project under Book Item 2.5b.(1) #2. See also related STIP Amendment 98S-127 under agenda Item 2.1a.(7).

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

The overall project for which a Negative Declaration has been completed and partial funding is being requested:

- Routes 5 and 113 in Yolo County- Construct direct connectors at the Routes 5/113 Interchange in the City of Woodland.

Phase 1 of the project is programmed in the 1998 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for construction in the 1999-2000 fiscal year at \$6.7 million (\$4.8 million capital funds, \$1.2 million support funds and \$0.7 million local funds). The current estimate for the total project is \$37.3 million (capital and support costs). Additional funds will have to be programmed in a future STIP to complete this project.

The Negative Declaration and supporting Initial Study has been transmitted to Commission staff.

The Department has approved the project for construction. This approval and the resulting filing of the Notice of Determination with the Office of Planning and Research will satisfy the environmental requirements for this stage of the project planning process.




Figure 2. Project Location Map - I-5/SR 113 Connector Project
