RECOMMENDATION

The Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission approve the following Resolution.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION

Resolved, that \$226,000 in State and Federal funds be allocated from the Budget Act of 1999, Item 2660-101-0042 and 2660-101-0890 for one (1) multi-program local assistance RIP/TEA project.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This Resolution allocates \$226,000 in state and federal funds for one (1) local assistance RIP/TEA project from the approved list in the 1998 STIP at an estimated cost of \$241,000, including \$15,000 from other sources.

The Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 requires that at least 10 percent of all Surface Transportation Program expenditures in each state be used for defined Transportation Enhancement Activities (TEA).

The CTC adopted guidelines for the TEA program through Resolution #G-93-3 in February 1993 (as amended June 7, 1995), and adopted the Initial Federal TEA Program through Resolution #G-93-12 in August 1993. The CTC adopted the second round of Federal TEA projects in the 1994 STIP in March 1994. The third round of Federal TEA projects was adopted into the 1996 STIP by CTC Resolution #G-96-21.
