## **ALLOCATIONS FOR EMERGENCY PROJECTS** **INFORMATION**

### **BACKGROUND**

The California Transportation Commission by Resolution G-11, as revised by Resolution G-94, delegated to the Department of Transportation (Department) authority to allocate funds to correct certain situations caused by floods, slides, earthquakes, material failures, slipouts, unusual accidents or other similar events. This allows the Department to immediately begin corrective action in an emergency condition without waiting for the next CTC meeting to receive an allocation.

This authority is operative whenever such an event:

1. Places people or property in jeopardy.
2. Causes or threatens to cause closure of transportation access necessary for;
  - a. Emergency assistance efforts.
  - b. The effective functioning of an area's services, commerce, manufacture or agriculture.
  - c. Persons in the area to reach their homes or employment.
3. Causes either an excessive increase in transportation congestion or delay, or an excessive increase in the necessary distances traveled.

The G-11 Resolution also requires the Department to notify the California Transportation Commission, at their next meeting, whenever such an emergency allocation has been made.

### **SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS**

Pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution G-11, State funds totaling \$750,000 have been allocated for three (3) emergency construction projects on the attached list.

Project #1, Route 101, Sonoma County, City of Cloverdale. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for construction of a soldier pile wall as a result of a slide caused by a storm on December 28, 2001.

Project #2, Route 001, Sonoma County, Near Town of Jenner. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary to reconstruct slope with geosynthetic reinforcement and underdrain systems due to a slipout on January 6, 2002.

Project #3, On Route 5, at various locations from 0.8 km South of Slate Creek Bridge to 0.9 km North of Gibson Road Overcrossing. – Initial G-11 Allocation was necessary for repairing storm damage and reestablishing drainage to prevent further encroachment of slide material into traveled way that occurred during the 2000/2001 winter season. This supplemental allocation is to repair slope damage that occurred during 2001/2002 winter season at one location and to upgrade a temporary drainage facility to a permanent drainage structure.
