ITEM 1.(3)

The following 8 agenda items are information reports and are deemed by staff not to raise any issue. The reports are included in the Commission Meeting Book mailed to each Commissioner for examination. **These items will not be presented or discussed at the meeting unless specifically requested by a Commissioner.**

2.1b. STIP Amendments for Notice

- 2.1b.(1)** Amend the STIP to declare the programmed Buckhorn Grade projects a “Corridor Project.” Combine all the programmed IIP environmental funds into one environmental only phase and program \$150,000 from Trinity County’s \$5,136,000 unprogrammed share balance and \$46,000 from Humboldt County’s \$24,475,000 unprogrammed share balance to cover the cost of additional environmental studies requested by Trinity and Humboldt.
- 2.1b.(3)** Amend the STIP to reduce San Bernardino County’s RIP contribution by \$713,000 and increase Federal Demonstration funding by the same amount on the Route 15 Main Street interchange project in the City of Hesperia.
- 2.1b.(4)** Amend the STIP to program \$4,683,000 from San Bernardino County’s \$87,676,000 unprogrammed share balance for six transit projects.

2.5f. Information Reports on Allocations made by Caltrans Under CTC Delegated Authority

- 2.5f.(1)** Six emergency condition allocations totaling \$2,233,000. Note the Department is pursuing recovery from the trucking company that damaged the Route 8/163 overcrossing (project # 6).
- 2.5f.(2)** Three SHOPP pavement rehabilitation allocations totaling \$8,686,000.
- 2.5f.(3)** Two SHOPP safety allocations totaling \$2,817,000.
- 2.5f.(4)** Sixteen local storm damage and pavement rehabilitation allocations totaling \$3,204,000.

3.2 Monthly Report on Caltrans projects voted but not awarded

The Department’s last report had three projects on the voted but not awarded list. Since the last report the Department awarded one project and add two new projects to the list.

Remaining projects from last report:

- Richmond-San Rafael Toll Bridge – seismic retrofit \$323,518,000 - bid opening was suspended while the Department federalizes the project. The Commission approved an extension to award the project until the end of November 2000. The Department opened bids for this project on August 8, 2000 and is reviewing the bids.
- Plu-L5727 mechanics facility, storage building and office space at the Quincy Maintenance Station in Plumas County \$2,740,000 – bids were opened in February 2000 and rejected. The Commission approved supplemental funding at the May 2000 meeting. The Department re-advertisement the project on August 28, 2000 with bid opening now scheduled for October 3, 2000.

New projects added to report:

- CC-4 guardrail upgrade, in Contra Costa County \$1,900,000 – original bid opening was delayed when errors were discovered in the bid documents. Documents were corrected and bid opening was rescheduled to September 12, 2000.
- LA-10 planting restoration project, in Los Angeles County \$1,540,000 – all bids were rejected when errors were discovered that could result in substantial claims. Project has been modified and should be ready for re-advertisement in October 2000.
