## **ALLOCATIONS FOR EMERGENCY PROJECTS** **INFORMATION**

### **BACKGROUND**

The California Transportation Commission (Commission) by Resolution G-11, as revised by Resolution G-94, delegated to the Department of Transportation (Department) authority to allocate funds to correct certain situations caused by floods, slides, earthquakes, material failures, slipouts, unusual accidents or other similar events. This allows the Department to immediately begin corrective action in an emergency condition without waiting for the next Commission meeting to receive an allocation.

This authority is operative whenever such an event:

1. Places people or property in jeopardy.
2. Causes or threatens to cause closure of transportation access necessary for;
  - a. Emergency assistance efforts.
  - b. The effective functioning of an area's services, commerce, manufacture or agriculture.
  - c. Persons in the area to reach their homes or employment.
3. Causes either an excessive increase in transportation congestion or delay, or an excessive increase in the necessary distances traveled.

The G-11 Resolution also requires the Department to notify the Commission, at their next meeting, whenever such an emergency allocation has been made.

### **SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS**

Pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution G-11, State funds totaling \$7,852,000 have been allocated for nine (9) emergency construction projects on the attached list.

Project #1, In Humboldt, near Somes Bar. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to construct a tie-back retaining wall and restore two lane roadway.

Project #2, In Mendocino, 16 kilometers south of the Sonoma/Mendocino County Line. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to repair fill slope with a geogrid earthen wall.

Project #3, Near Oroville, at Cherokee Overhead. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to repair metal guardrail damaged by fire.

Project #4, At various locations, from 0.8 kilometers south of Slate Creek Bridge to 0.9 kilometers north of Gibson Road Overcrossing. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to stabilize sideslopes, repair and reestablish drainage.

Project #5, At various locations from 1.0 kilometers north of Panoramic highway to 1.8 kilometers south of Stinson Beach. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to repair slipouts of shoulder slopes and embankment.

Project #6, In Rancho Palos Verdes, at Western Avenue and Park Western Drive. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to repair and replace deteriorated portions of storm drainage system.

Project #7, Near Lee Vining, from Ellery Lake Dam to 0.6 kilometers east of Poole Power Plant Road. – Award G-11 Allocation was necessary to remove rock slides and repair roadway.

Project #8, In Del Norte County, about 0.3 kilometers north of Patrick's Creek Bridge #1-14. – Supplemental G-11 Allocation was necessary to install a chain link rock retaining system and chain link rock draping.

Project #9, Near Piercy, from 0.8 to 1.3 kilometers south of Red Mountain Creek Bridge. – Supplemental G-11 Allocation was necessary to complete final grading and drainage repairs.
