**DELEGATION OF ALLOCATION AUTHORITY**  
**LOCAL ASSISTANCE ALLOCATIONS FOR LOCAL STORM DAMAGE**  
**AND LOCAL STREET AND ROAD PAVEMENT REHABILITATION PROJECTS**  
**RESOLUTION G-99-09 ALLOCATIONS**

**BACKGROUND**

On March 30, 1999, the California Transportation Commission delegated to the Department authority to allocate funds by Resolution G-99-09 for Local Storm Damage and Local Street and Road Pavement Rehabilitation projects. In addition, the Commission delegated to the Department authority to advance the allocation by one year with the approval of the responsible regional agency. This authority allows the local agencies to begin work without waiting for the next CTC meeting to receive an allocation and to begin work earlier if the project or component is ready for implementation one year earlier.

These Local Storm Damage and Local Street and Road Pavement Rehabilitation projects are included in the adopted State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

**SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS**

Pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution G-99-09, the Department made three separate allocations totaling \$2,855,000, for three Local Storm Damage and Local Street and Road Pavement Rehabilitation projects. A list of the allocations is attached. Pursuant to the authority for advancing the allocation by one year, there were no allocations made during this report period for projects scheduled for implementation in Fiscal Year (FY) 01-02.

To date for FY 00-01, a total of \$12,178,000 has been allocated for 29 projects, of which \$262,000 was for one project scheduled for implementation in FY 01-02.

Of the \$300 million authorized for Local Road Rehabilitation activities, approximately \$291.2 million has been programmed through November 2000 CTC actions. No new rehabilitation programming commitments are proposed for the December 2000 CTC Meeting, outside the adoption of the 2000 STIP. The total amount for local rehabilitation projects programmed is approximately \$291.2 million.
