Ref: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

ISSUE:

The facilities in the relinquishment resolutions summarized below are safe and drivable or have been maintained in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the California Transportation Commission (Commission) meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation recommends the Commission approve the following Relinquishment Resolutions:

Resolution No. R-3589 – 4-SCI-85-PM R16.0 (Request No. 56062) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Cupertino, at Cleo Avenue, consisting of a cul-de-sac. The City, by freeway agreement dated October 15, 1990, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State and by letter dated August 27, 2004, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3590 – 4-Ala-260-PM R0.0/R0.6 (Request No. 56068) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes a portion of Route 260 right of way in the City of Alameda, between Atlantic Avenue and Central Avenue, under terms and conditions as stated in the cooperative agreement dated May 21, 2004, determined to be in the best interest of the State. Authorized by Chapter 325, Statutes of 2004, which amended Section 560 of the Streets and Highways Code.

Resolution No. R-3591 – 5-SLO-101-PM 49.3 (Request No. 8421) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Atascadero, at San Ramon Road, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city streets and frontage roads. The City, by cooperative agreement dated July 27, 2004, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3592 – 12-Ora-5-PM 39.6 (Request No. R120015) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Anaheim, at Mariposa Place, consisting of a cul-de-sac. The City, by freeway agreement dated November 9, 1992 and by amendment to freeway agreement dated July 9, 1996, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired November 10, 2004, without exception.
