Ref: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

ISSUE:

It has been determined that the facilities described in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below are not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all right, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. Each facility is safe and drivable or has been maintained in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the California Transportation Commission (Commission) meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation recommends the Commission approve the following Relinquishment Resolutions:

Resolution No. R-3626 – 3-Sut-20-PM 2.5/5.4 (Request No. 32034-X) – 6 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the County of Sutter, between Hageman Road and West Butte Road, consisting of reconstructed and relocated county roads, frontage roads, cul-de-sacs, and a bridge. The County, by cooperative agreement, dated May 23, 1995, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired October 16, 2005, without exception.

Resolution No. R-3627 – 6-Fre-180-PM R61.2/R63.2 (KP R98.6/R101.66) (Request No. 85312) –
10 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the County of Fresno, from North Winery Avenue to Sunnyside Avenue, consisting of reconstructed and relocated county roads, frontage roads, and cul-de-sacs. The County, by cooperative agreement dated, May 24, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3628 – 6-Fre-180-PM R61.1/R62.9 (KP R98.36/R101.23) (Request No. 85313) –
4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Fresno, between Chestnut Avenue and Clovis Avenue, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city streets, frontage roads, and cul-de-sacs. The City, by cooperative agreement dated, January 27, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
