Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

ISSUE:

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below are not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all right, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. Consequently, the facility is safe and drivable, or has been maintained in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution No. R-3665 – 6-Fre-180-PM 61.43/63.04
(Request No. 85722) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Fresno, between Chestnut Avenue and Clovis Avenue, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The City, by cooperative agreement dated January 27, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3666 – 6-Fre-180-PM 62.68/63.45(Request No. 85721) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Fresno, between Peach Avenue and Clovis Avenue, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The County, by cooperative agreement dated May 24, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3667 – 7-LA-210U,210-PM R4.1/7.7,R48.7/R52.2Request No. 1228B) – 5 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Claremont, between Williams Avenue and the Los Angeles/San Bernardino County line, consisting of superseded highway right of way, reconstructed and relocated city streets, frontage roads and cul-de-sacs. The City, by cooperative agreement dated June 27, 2007, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3668 – 8-Riv-79-PM 26.4/M32.1(Request No. 459-R) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Jacinto, under terms and conditions as stated in the cooperative agreement, dated June 4, 2007, determined to be in the best interest of the State. Authorized by Chapter 318, Statutes of 2006, which amended Section 379 of the Streets and Highways Code.

Resolution No. R-3669 – 8-SBd-395-PM 4.49/4.55Request No. 407-S) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Hesperia, at Outpost Road, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city street. The City, by relinquishment cooperative agreement dated April 16, 2007, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3670 – 12-Ora-73-PM R25.8/R26.5Request No. R120004) – 4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Costa Mesa, from the South City Limit to 0.4 mile North of Red Hill Avenue, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city streets. The City, by relinquishment cooperative agreement dated June 4, 2007, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
