Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summaries.

ISSUE:

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. The facility is safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution R-3716 – 03-Sac-50-PM R2.6

(Request No. 035603-X) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Sacramento along Route 50 adjacent and parallel to the eastbound off ramp to 65th Street, consisting of nonmotorized transportation facilities, namely a pedestrian walkway. The City, by cooperative agreement dated September 26, 2008, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3717 – 04-SCI-85-PM 7.3/9.3

(Request No. 56051) – 10 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Jose along Route 85 from Meridian Avenue to Union Avenue, consisting of relocated or reconstructed city streets, and frontage roads. The City, by freeway agreements dated December 11, 1990 and May 3, 1994, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired December 10, 2008, without exception.

Resolution R-3718 – 04-SCI-85-PM 9.1/9.3(Request No. 56052) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Santa Clara along Route 85 on Branham Lane between 0.1 mile west of Standish Drive and Union Avenue, consisting of a frontage road. The County, by freeway agreement dated December 11, 1990, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired December 11, 2008, without exception.

Resolution R-3719 – 07-Ven-101-PM 13.8/14.2(Request No. 1234) – 8 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Camarillo along Route 101 from Route 34 (Lewis Road) to Arneill Road, consisting of relocated or reconstructed city streets, frontage roads, and parking facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated February 12, 1997, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired December 25, 2008, without exception.

Resolution R-3720 – 08-SBd-15-PM 45.27/47.52(Request No. 470-S) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the town of Apple Valley along Route 15 on East Frontage Road from the town limit line to Stoddard Wells Road, consisting of a frontage road and adjacent drainage facilities. The Town, by cooperative agreement dated January 7, 2009, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3721 – 08-Riv-111-PM 47.11/47.22(Request No. 478-R) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Cathedral City along Route 111 east of Golf Club Drive, consisting of highway right of way that is no longer part of the State Highway System. The City, by relinquishment cooperative agreement dated November 21, 2008, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3722 – 11-SD-8-PM 6.6(Request No. R27192) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Diego along Route 8 on Alvarado Canyon Road west of Mission Gorge Place, consisting of reconstructed city streets. The City, by cooperative agreement dated May 3, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
