Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. The facility is safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3731 – 04-SCI-101-PM R35.8  
(Request No. 56087) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Jose along Route 101 on N 31<sup>st</sup> Street, consisting of a relocated or reconstructed city street and an adjoining nonmotorized transportation facility, namely a pedestrian walkway. The City of San Jose, by freeway agreement dated February 25, 2003, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired May 28, 2009, without exception.

Resolution R-3732 – 07-LA-110-PM 0.0/R0.8  
(Request No. 1230) – 3 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Los Angeles on Route 110. City of Los Angeles is scheduled to approve the cooperative agreement in late May 2009. The City, by said agreement, will waive the 90-day notice requirement and agree to accept title upon relinquishment by the State under terms and conditions to be in the best interest of the State. Authorized by Chapter 669, Statutes of 2008, which amended Section 410 of the Streets and Highways Code.
