Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

ISSUE:

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. The facility is safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution R-3733 – 01-Men-175-PM 1.15
(Request No. 1235) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Mendocino along Route 175 in Old Hopland at East Side Road, consisting of a reconstructed and relocated county road. The County of Mendocino, by cooperative relinquishment agreement dated April 17, 2007, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3734 – 01-DN-101-PM 26.2
(Request No. 1240) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Crescent City along Route 101 at Elk Creek, consisting of nonmotorized transportation facilities, namely the Harbor Trail Bridge and trailhead. The City of Crescent City, by resolution dated April 20, 2009, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
