Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. The facility is safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3747 – 03-Sac-16-PM R22.00/R23.96  
(Request No. 034082-X) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Sacramento along Route 16 at Michigan Bar Road and Ione Road, consisting of reconstructed county road connections. The County of Sacramento, by letter dated July 2, 2009, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3748 – 05-SB-246-PM 28.6  
(Request No. 11093) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Solvang along Route 246 at Skytt Mesa Drive, consisting of a collateral facility. The City of Solvang, by cooperative agreement dated November 27, 2007, and by amendment No. 1 to agreement dated August 10, 2009, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3749 – 11-SD-94-PM 9.3/R10.4; 11-SD-125-PM 12.8/13.3  
(Request No. R27228-A) – 4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of La Mesa along Routes 94 and 125 between Grove Street and Spring Street, consisting of relocated and reconstructed county roads and frontage roads. The County of San Diego, by freeway agreement dated September 30, 1968, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State to roads which on that date were within an unincorporated area of the county and have since been annexed by the City. The 90-day notice period expired October 6, 2009, without exception.
