Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolution in the county where the facility is located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facility to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agency identified in the summary. The facility is safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3757 – 01-Men-101U-PM 0.0/0.6  
(Request No. 1207) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Mendocino along Route 101U (Geyser Road) from the Sonoma County line to Route 101, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The County of Mendocino, by relinquishment agreement dated March 2, 2010, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3758 – 04-SCI-152-PM R23.2/R24.3  
(Request No. 56016) – 5 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Santa Clara along Route 152 and Casa De Fruta Parkway, consisting of superseded highway right of way and collateral facilities. The County of Santa Clara, by controlled access highway agreement dated July 21, 1987, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired January 28, 2010, without exception.

Resolution R-3759 – 10-Mer-99-PM 10.04/12.30  
(Request No. 16115) – 3 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Merced along Route 99 from 0.1 miles south of McHenry Road to Mission Avenue, consisting of superseded highway right of way and collateral facilities. The County of Merced, by freeway agreement dated April 24, 2007, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired December 3, 2009, without exception.

Resolution R-3760 – 11-SD-125-PM 11.4/12.8  
(Request No. R27227) – 9 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Lemon Grove along Route 125 between Ildica Street and Sweetwater Way, consisting of collateral facilities. The County of San Diego, by freeway agreements dated September 30, 1968 and January 2, 1969, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State to roads which on that date were within an unincorporated area of the county and have since been annexed by the City of Lemon Grove. The 90-day notice period expired January 12, 2010, without exception.
