Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolutions in the county where the facilities are located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facilities to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agencies identified in the summary. The facilities are safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3806 – 11-Imp-111-PM 23.2/23.4  
(Request No. R31151) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Imperial on Route 111 from the northerly city limits of Brawley to the realigned Route 78, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The County, by controlled access highway agreement dated May 6, 2003, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period will expire on July 20, 2011. A protest is not expected as the County anticipates approval of this relinquishment.

Resolution R-3807 – 12-Ora-5-PM 38.8/39.2  
(Request No. R120025) – 3 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Anaheim along Route 5 on W. Lincoln Avenue and N. Manchester Avenue, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated November 9, 1992 and amendment to freeway agreement dated July 9, 1996, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired July 12, 2011, without exception.

Resolution R-3808 – 10-Cal-4-PM 22.15/22.43  
(Request No. 16396) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the County of Calaveras along Route 4 from the easterly city limits of the City of Angels to the realigned Route 4, consisting of superseded highway right of way and a new road connection. The County, by cooperative agreement dated August 4, 2003, by amendment to agreement dated May 30, 2008, and by amendment to agreement dated May 12, 2011, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
