SUBJECT: SJCOG FTIP AMENDMENT NO. 26

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have completed the review of Amendment No. 26 to the San Joaquin County Association of Governments (SJCOG) Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) that was submitted by your letter dated March 17, 2010. This amendment to SJCOG's FTIP:

- o Adds and/or modifies projects in the SJCOG region, including 12 projects in the SHOPP program and 1 project funded by local monies.

Pursuant to the July 15, 2004, *Memorandum of Understanding between the Federal Highway Administration, California Division, and the Federal Transit Administration, Region IX*, we accept the modifications to the 2008/09 – 2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) for the SJCOG region in accordance with the Final Rule on Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning published in the February 14, 2007 Federal Register.

We find that the SJCOG's FTIP, through Amendment No. 26, was developed through a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process carried out in accordance with the metropolitan planning provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134, and 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 as amended by Section 6001 of Public Law 109-59, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).

We have determined that this program modification is exempt from the regional emissions analysis requirements pursuant to the transportation conformity provisions found in 40 CFR Part


