SUBJECT: StanCOG FTIP Amendment No. 22

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have completed the review of Amendment No. 22 to the Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG) Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) that was submitted by your letter dated June 23, 2010. This amendment to StanCOG's FTIP:

- o Adds and/or modifies 7 projects (2 new and 5 existing) funded from the SHOPP Program (1 new), CMAQ Program (5 existing), and FTA Section 5310 Program (1 new).

Pursuant to the July 21, 2004, *Memorandum of Understanding between the Federal Highway Administration, California Division, and the Federal Transit Administration, Region IX*, we accept the modifications to the 2008/09 – 2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) for the StanCOG region in accordance with the Final Rule on Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning published in the February 14, 2007 Federal Register.

We find that the StanCOG's FTIP, through Amendment No. 22, was developed through a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process carried out in accordance with the metropolitan planning provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134, and 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 as amended by Section 6001 of Public Law 109-59, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).
