Ebbetts Pass Scenic Byway Gateway Monuments and Signage At-A-Glance



PROJECT OVERVIEW

The proposed project will design and install gateway monuments along SR-4/89 at the western and eastern entrances to the Ebbetts Pass National Scenic Byway, one of just seven National Scenic Byways in California, in the towns of Arnold (Calaveras County) and Markleeville (Alpine County), install route confidence markers and other related signage, including interpretive elements and related visitor amenities. This will be consistent with prior completed work to create an Ebbetts Pass Wayshowing & Interpretive Plan, previously developed for the Ebbetts Pass Corridor and completed in 2014.

Concepts of the gateway monuments or Site Approach Markers (shown in pictures above) were developed as part of the Wayshowing & Interpretive Plan. Caltrans has engaged with and will partner with Ebbetts Pass Scenic Byway Association and USFS to assist with the community engagement plan and implement the project.
