State Beautification Projects

- Projects: 12 State Highway Beautification projects conceptualized, approved, and initiated.
- Locations: In 15 cities as well as unincorporated areas of Orange County.
- Project types: Culturally-themed Parks & Recreation areas, gateway monuments, murals, aesthetic treatments, pedestrian/bike trail enhancements, upgraded fencing, groundcover, and hardscaping.

Cleanup and Beautification

- Litter Collection: 83,799 cubic yards of litter collected in Orange County since the start of Clean CA, compared to 32,158 cubic yards prior to Clean CA (260% performance increase).
- Graffiti removal: 347,955 sq ft of graffiti removed, compared to 201,822 sq ft prior to Clean CA.



Free Dump Days and Paper Shredding Events

- Events: 27 Free Dump Days and/or Paper Shredding events held in Orange County. More than 13,000 cubic yards removed, including mattresses, appliances, etc. Developed partnerships with Goodwill and My E-waste Dropoff to collect all electronic waste and to divert gently used items from reaching the landfill.
- Locations: Events held in Buena Park, Costa Mesa, Brea, Lake Forest, Fullerton, Huntington Beach, Irvine, Orange, Placentia, Rancho Santa Margarita, Santa Ana, Seal Beach, Silverado, and Tustin.

Adopt-A-Highway

178 Highway Adoptions: 84% increase in adoptions and 1,207 cubic yards of highway litter removed since the beginning of the Clean CA program. A GIS map was created to enable the general public to easily identify adoptable site locations.

Job Creation

- Total Hires: 44 out of 44 field positions filled.
- Butte County Office of Education Back 2 Work program:
 - Contract amendment for 100 statewide crews for \$149.6M was fully executed on July 28, 2022.
 - 8 full-time Clean California Back 2 Work litter crews are active in Orange County.



Maintenance Agreements

5 Clean California Maintenance Agreements were approved to pay Cities for Litter and/or Graffiti
removal covering portions of SR-1, SR-39, SR-55, SR-57, SR-90, SR-91, SR-73, SR-133, I-5, and I-405.
