About the Study

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is conducting a study that will evaluate the potential traffic, safety, air quality, and noise impacts of removing the existing truck restriction on I-580 between Oakland and San Leandro.

Why

Since 1951, large trucks have been prohibited on part of I-580 from Foothill Boulevard in San Leandro to Grand Avenue in Oakland. As a result, truck traffic has been routed to I-880, contributing to health and environmental impacts in nearby neighborhoods.

How

The Study is made up of four components:

- Traffic Assessment
- Noise and Air Quality Assessment
- Racial Equity Assessment
- Comprehensive Community Engagement Strategy



FAQ

1. What is the I-580 Truck Access Study?

Answer: Caltrans, in partnership with the Bay Area Air District and the City of Oakland, are conducting a study to evaluate how removing the existing truck weight restriction on I-580, commonly referred to as the I-580 truck ban, would affect safety, reliability, and efficiency along the I-880 and I-580 corridors in Oakland and neighboring communities, and how this change would impact public health for impacted populations.

2. Will the I-580 truck ban be removed as a result of this study?

Answer: No, this is only a study to help understand what would happen if the truck weight restriction was removed. An act of State legislation would be required to remove the restriction from the California Vehicle Code.

3. Where is the truck ban in effect?

Answer: On I-580 between Grand Avenue in Oakland and Foothill Boulevard in San Leandro.

4. What are the I-580 Truck Access Study limits?

Answer: On I-580, near the unincorporated communities of Ashland and Cherryland to I-80 in Oakland and on I-880, from I-238 in San Leandro to I-80 in Oakland.

5. Why is the I-580 Truck Access Study being conducted now?

Answer: Caltrans is responding to community concerns and implementing strategies recommended by the West Oakland Community Action Plan (2019) to help improve community health.

6. How long will the I-580 Truck Access Study take to be completed?

Answer: Approximately 18 to 24 months. The final report will be completed in late 2026/early 2027.
