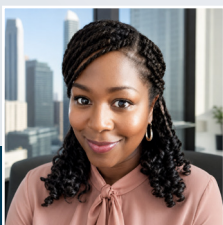

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PROJECT SUMMARY

In the Summer of 2026, Caltrans begins the process of building the Interstate-280 (I-280) Farallones Street pedestrian overcrossing (POC) to replace the existing Whipple Avenue POC which will be demolished. Located in the Cayuga Park neighborhood in the Excelsior/Outer Mission, the new POC will be Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant and feature a wider design, expanding from 8 to 10 feet. This enhancement will improve accessibility and connectivity for eco-friendly transportation while ensuring the structure blends with the neighborhood's aesthetic. The rehabilitation project includes upgrades along I-280 throughout San Francisco. The I-280 upgrades and rebuilding of the overcrossing will impact pedestrians and motorists throughout construction.

WORK DESCRIPTION

The 60-year-old Farallones Street POC was necessary following the construction of I-280 in the early 1960s. The POC connect the Oceanview neighborhood to the Excelsior neighborhood and provided access to Cayuga Park. The structure's steep 14 percent grade is difficult for pedestrians to use and the new POC is ADA-compliant with maximum of 8 percent grades. The new POC will hopefully attract users of all abilities and will provide new features including artwork on its walls and landscape.

The I-280 upgrades will include new polyester concrete pavement at the US 101/I-280 interchange, asphalt concrete paving at all of the I-280 on and off ramps throughout San Francisco, upgraded concrete median barriers, rehabilitation of drainage systems, ADA compliant curb ramp upgrades and a new Changeable Message Sign (CMS) at the Chase Center Mariposa off ramp.

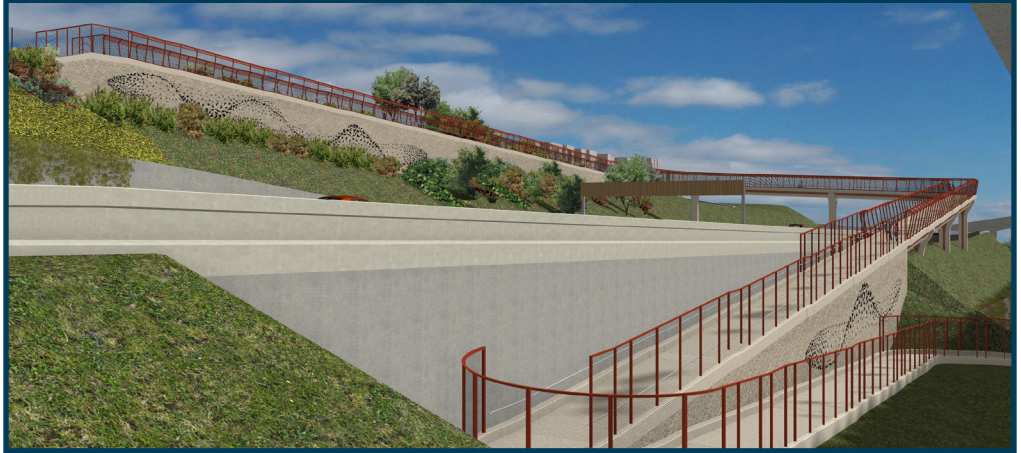
FREEWAY CLOSURES & LANE REDUCTIONS
