elcome to the Oakland Alameda Access Project Newsletter! We're here to keep you informed about upcoming work, what you may see along the route, and how the project is moving forward.

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

Right now, crews are working on Oak Street sidewalk safety improvements, the Oak Street off-ramp retaining wall, the Webster Tube bike and pedestrian walkway, and the connecting bike path and sidewalk at Mariner Square Loop.

Crews are progressing as planned, and our Public Information Office is actively coordinating updates with nearby residents, businesses, and community partners.

The Alameda County Transportation Commission (Alameda CTC) has approved funding for a new \$2 flat-rate parking program at the Pacific Renaissance Plaza Garage in Oakland's Chinatown. This investment helps offset the impacts of ongoing construction in the area and supports the community during major infrastructure work.

The garage is open daily from 7 AM to 10 PM, with a flat \$2 rate after 4 PM Monday–Saturday and after 2 PM on Sundays.



WHAT IS BEING WORKED ON NOW?

Crews have been excavating, forming, and pouring foundations along Oak Street to support new roadway features like traffic signal poles, signs, and utility structures. This early foundation work is why people may see open trenches, construction equipment, and crews working in the roadway. These foundational elements must be completed before the sidewalks can be finished. As ramps and sidewalks are completed, they will reopen to the public.

The bike lane has been repainted on Oak Street. Please slow down, look for cyclists, and share the path to keep everyone safe.

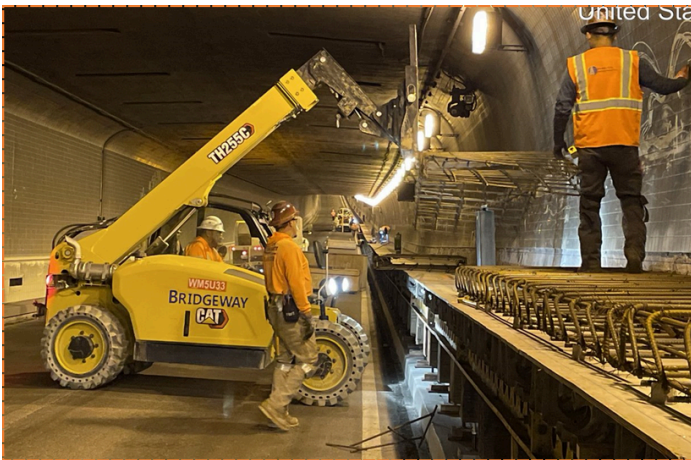
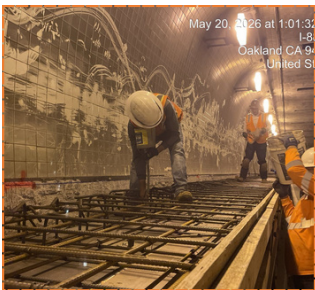

Inside the Webster Tube, crews are progressing on the new bike-pedestrian walkway by installing reinforcement cages, drilling and bonding steel dowels, and forming the concrete sections that will shape the path. Teams are placing rebar, pouring fresh concrete, and curing each segment before moving on to the next. As each completed section is stripped and prepared, the walkway continues to take shape throughout the tunnel.

On Mariner Square Loop, crews have finished the new driveway landing into the business park and reopened it with fresh asphalt. They're also preparing for upgraded street lighting by marking pole locations, pouring concrete bases, and installing underground conduit. All of this work helps prepare the area for new sidewalks — and eventually the bike-and-pedestrian connection to the Webster Tube.
