Pavement Rehabilitation & Complete Street Project Newsletter

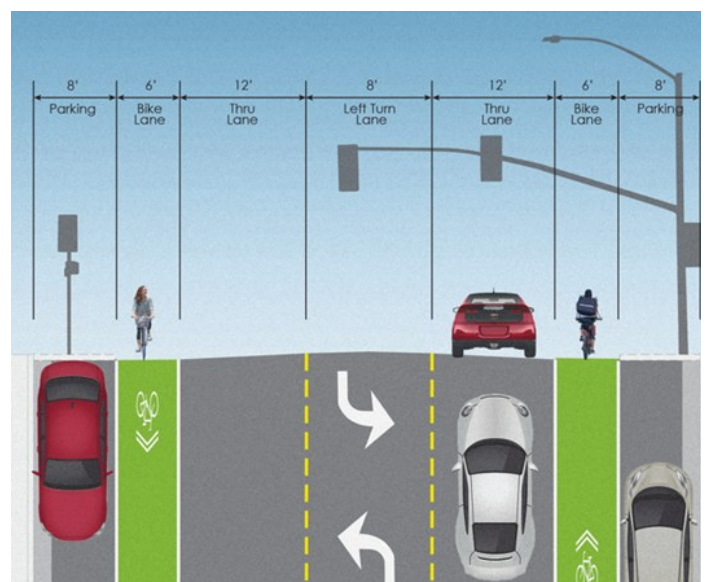
Welcome to the first installment of the State Route—29 (SR-29) Pavement Rehabilitation and Complete Street Project Newsletter. The purpose of this newsletter is to bring information to you, the public, who will be using the route and seeing the work as it progresses.

So what is happening on SR-29? First off the Pavement Rehabilitation. This means the 6-mile stretch from Cal Poly Maritime to North of Mini Drive at the Solano/Napa County line will see a much needed repaving. Say good bye to the bumpy ride down SR-29 and the need to avoid pot holes. In addition, SR-29 will also see Complete Street elements added in.

What does Complete Streets mean? It means the design for the rehabilitation of SR-29 does not just have the motorist in mind. It has everyone in mind, pedestrians, cyclists and drivers. It enables ac-

cess for all users of all ages and abilities.

Some of the elements Vallejo will see as the Complete Streets design becomes a reality are bicyclist will have protected bike lanes in high-speed areas of the segment and will encourage more bicycle travel, a lane diet with green painted bike lanes in the residential and downtown areas will facilitate street parking and a much brighter downtown that includes more streetlights.





Pedestrians will also be able to enjoy the Bulb outs in the downtown area because intersections will see a slow down in traffic, increasing safety for pedestrians crossing the street.

This project is split into 3 phases and work will be started in Segment 3 from Mississippi Street to the Napa/Solano county line. The work will occur at night, so residents may hear some jack hammering and the sound of saws starting the process of breaking down the medians. There will be a lane closure during the night and only one available lane on each side of the road to ensure safety of the public and works.



On September 12, 2025, a ground breaking was held by Caltrans along with STA and Bay Cities. Many expressed the need for this project and how excited the community will be to see a major street go through a transformation. And here soon construction will begin. It will be messy and nosy, so we ask that you bare with us through this.
