

SBT US101 Pavement Rehabilitation Project

San Benito County - Highway 101 - Post Mile 0/7.55 | Project 05-1J840 | Updated June 2026

Description

This project will improve US 101 in San Benito County from post miles 0.00 (Monterey County line) to post mile 7.55 (Santa Clara County line). The project will rehabilitate pavement and drainage systems, upgrade traffic safety systems, replace Transportation Management System elements, and improve wildlife connectivity.

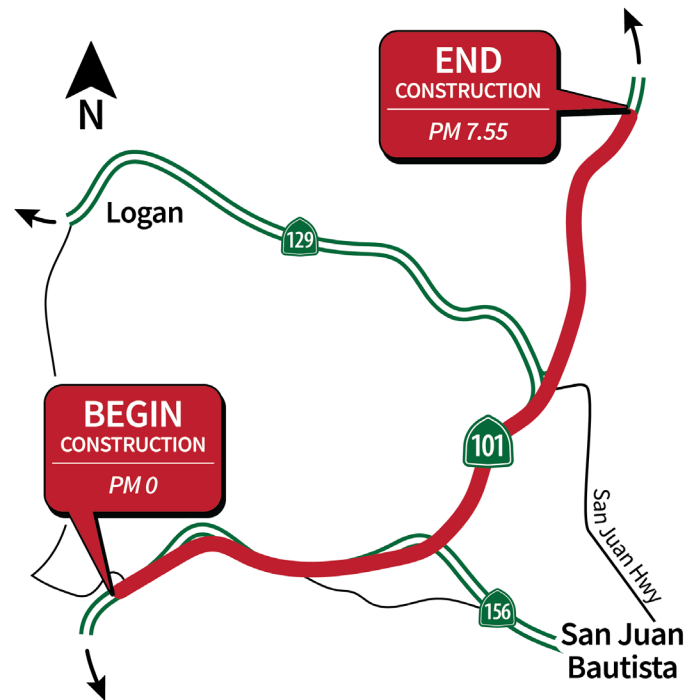


Purpose and Need

This project will extend the life of the existing pavement, restore drainage systems in poor condition, upgrade safety systems to current standards, maintain an efficient transportation system, and improve wildlife connectivity. Currently, the pavement within the project limits is exhibiting distress and unacceptable ride quality and 28 drainage systems within the project limits are deteriorating. If left untreated, these conditions will result in increasingly higher maintenance costs in the future and possible roadway/embankment failure. In addition, barrier systems need upgrading to current standards and three traffic census stations will need replacement or repair. Finally, the project will improve wildlife connectivity by enlarging two drainage culverts to create a wildlife crossing that passes under the US 101 travel lanes. The repairs for this project will be conducted based on the 2016/2017 assessment of the culvert inventory.

Location

On US 101 in San Benito County from, PM 0.0 to 7.55, Monterey County line to Santa Clara County Line.
