

Guadalupe to Santa Maria SR 166 CAPM

Santa Barbara County - Highway 166 - Post Mile 0/8.927 | Project 05-1M310 | Updated May 2025



Purpose and Need

The purpose of this project is to preserve and extend the life of the existing pavement, install count stations, update guardrail to MASH standards, and update curb ramps to meet ADA compliance. The pavement within the project limits is exhibiting deterioration and could require additional maintenance efforts if not addressed. The curb ramps Caltrans has identified do not meet ADA compliance, portions of guardrail does not meet MASH standards, and various signs are damaged or need replacement. Additionally, existing count station conditions will not provide effective traffic monitoring

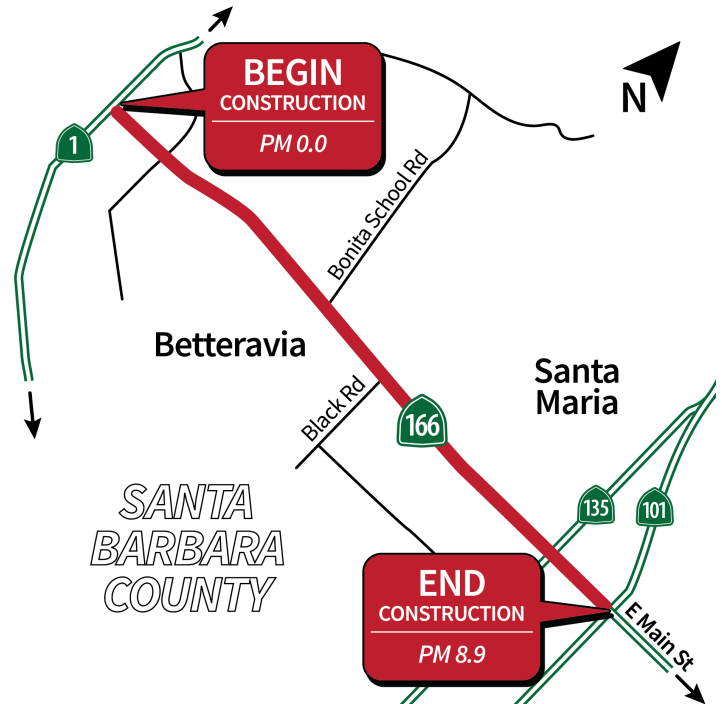


Description

The Guadalupe to Santa Maria Highway 166 CAPM is located in Santa Barbara County on the Highway 1/166 junction in the community of Guadalupe to the Highway 101 interchange in the City of Santa Maria. This project plans to preserve a quantity of lane miles of flexible Class 2 and 3 pavement using CAPM strategies, including shoulder backing, replace Transportation Management System (TMS) elements, reconstruct guardrail, replace signs, and upgrade facilities to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. It will also signalize Highway 1/166 and Highway 166/Obispo Street Intersections and install complete streets elements along Hwy 166 from Highway 1 to Flower Ave.

Location

In Santa Barbara County in and near Guadalupe from the State Route 1 junction to the State Route 101 junction.
