Project Information

This project is located is on State Route 246 in Santa Barbara County in and near the City of Lompoc, from State Route 1 to 0.05 mile east of the Domingos Road intersection.



Purpose

To preserve and extend the life of the existing pavement, rehabilitate pavement and culverts, upgrade guardrails, upgrade sign panels, and replace the Santa Ynez River Bridge (Robinson Bridge) to accommodate pedestrians, bicyclists, and flooding.

Description

The project proposes to replace the Robinson Bridge on SR 246 near the City of Lompoc. The structure is encountering cracking in the concrete deck and scour of the piers. The new bridge includes a multiuse pathway in the westbound direction and a 6-foot sidewalk on the eastbound direction. Additional improvements throughout the project limits includes:

- Culvert improvements
- Resurfacing asphalt concrete pavement and replacing dike
- **Vegetation control**
- Upgrading existing signs and pavement markings
- Upgrading guardrail and end treatments
- Adding new sidewalk and reconstructing curb ramps
