




Using the Chat and Q&A Features in WebEx

To send a chat message:

1. Open the Chat panel in the lower right corner:



- 2. In the Send to or To drop-down list, select the recipient of the message.
- 3. Enter your message in the chat text box, then press Enter on your keyboard.

To submit a question via the Q&A Panel:

1. Open the Q&A panel by clicking the "..." in the Participants O Chat ...

- 2. Click in the drop-down menu and select "All Cohost" as the recipient of the question.
- 3. Enter your question in the text box and press Enter on your keyboard.

Certifications Recognized by Caltrans

State Funded Projects

(When project funding is ONLY state dollars)

Small Business (SB)/Small Business - Public Works (SBPW)

25% Goal

Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE)

5% Goal

Federally Funded Projects

(When projects have ANY AMOUNT of federal dollars)

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)

22.2% Goal



Benefits of Small Business Certification

- 5% bid preference on applicable state solicitations
- Prompt payment Act
- Networking Opportunities
- Listing in the Statewide Small Business Database



5% SB Bid Preference

Bidder A

Not a Certified SB

Bids \$100,000

Bidder B

Is a Certified SB

Bids \$102,000

\$102,000

\$100,000

.05 (5%)

\$ 5,000

- \$**5,000** \$ 97,000

Bidder A Bid = \$100,000

Adjusted Bidder B Bid =\$97,000

Bidder B wins the contract for the <u>original</u> amount of \$102,000



Benefits of Disabled Veteran Business (DVBE) Certification

- Receives same benefits as a certified SB
- SB/DVBE Option



SB/DVBE Option

Solicitation Thresholds	Minimum	Maximum
Goods, Services, Information Technology	\$5000	\$249,999
Public Works	\$5000	\$333,000



Benefits of Disadvantaged Business (DBE) Certification

- Certification is recognized by 600 local agencies in California.
- Expands opportunities to participate in federally-funded projects.
- Become accessible to prime contractors needing to fulfill DBE participation goal requirements.
- Listing in official directories such as the DBE database used by prime contractors.
- Increase opportunities to network at events such as procurement fairs and pre-bids
- Eligible for mentor protégé opportunities such as Caltrans' Calmentor programs.

Bid Opportunities


Step 1:

Contractors Corner

Contractors Corner is an online portal designed to provide construction contract opportunities to businesses in the state of California. This website gives businesses access to advertisements, bidding and contracting resources for all Caltrans districts statewide.



Navigating Through Contractors Corner

Step 1:

Go to, select Start Search

Step 2:

Click "Advertised Projects"



Step 3:

Click "All Advertised Projects" to view projects for each district.

There will be multiple contract to choose from. Review the advertisements and choose a contract advertisement that is best for your firm.





Opt-In Program

- Opt-in is a feature that allows contractors to be considered for subcontractor or supplier bids.
- Prime contractors looking for suppliers will see the information you provide when they search for nonbidding plan holders.

Minor B Contracts

- Contracts valued at \$333,000 or less.
- District Director Orders valued less than \$333,000 are classified as Minor B contracts.

What's the difference between a Small Business and a Micro Business?

The applicable difference is the limit of employees (less than 10) and \$5,000,000 or less.
