




Using the Chat and Q&A Features in WebEx

Benefits of Certification

- 5% Bid Preference for Small Business
- The State may offer up to a 5% incentive to DVBE's in the formal bid process
- As a California certified SB/DVBE, your firm is added to the Department of General Services' certified firm database
- Caltrans' State funded procurement & contracts Goals:
 - Small Business (SB) = 25% Disabled Veterans Business Enterprise (DVBE) = 5%



PROCUREMENT METHODS















Solicitation Packages for Commodities

Fair & Reasonable - for less than \$10,000

SB/DVBE Option - \$5,000.01-\$249,999.99

Up to \$50,000 (Non-IT)

\$50,000-\$99,999 (unable to use the SB/DVBE option)



Fair & Reasonable

Competition is always the preferred method of acquisition.

- Caltrans may acquire IT and Non-IT goods and services valued at less \$10,000 if fair and reasonable pricing can be established without receiving alternate quotes.
- There are five methods of fair and reasonable pricing including:
 - Price Comparison
 - Catalog or Market Pricing
 - Historical Pricing



SB/DVBE Option

Certified SB/DVBE

- Goods & Services and IT goods and services - \$5,000.01 to \$249,999.99
- Public Works \$5,000.01 to \$333,000.00
- At least two price quotes (two SBs or two DVBEs)
- No Advertising
- Authorized by Govt Code 14838.5

IT Goods/Services Procurement

Advertised:

- IT goods in excess of \$100,000
- IT services in excess of \$10,000.00
- IT goods and services in excess of \$10,000.00 on the service portion only

Route 140 after emergency contract repairs (1997 photo) Caltrans partners with contractors to perform emergency repairs when washouts, landslides, slipouts, earthquakes or other emergencies occur.

All Contractors Are Invited To Tell Us What You Can Do.

Typical types of work:

- Hazardous Materials;
- Reconstruct pavement under emergency conditions;
- Excavate slopes or construct embankment;
- Rent heavy equipment Caltrans on short notice;
- Demolish damaged structures:
- Remove and replace culverts or drains;
- Provide temporary traffic control;
- ...and others not listed

All contractors of all sizes are invited to express their interest in potentially performing emergency work for Caltrans.

When an emergency strikes, Caltrans may use emergency procedures to immediately select a contractor to reopen damaged facilities. The purpose of the registry is to provide a list of contractors potentially available for emergency work if needed.


