## Subject: CLARIFICATION REGARDING FEDERAL ENDANGERED SPECIES LIST VALIDITY

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide clarification regarding the need for current species lists in accordance with the Federal Endangered Species Act Section 7 consultation process and the requirement that these lists be verified and/or updated at certain environmental document milestones (e.g., Draft Environmental Document (DED)/Final Environmental Document (FED), revalidations, and re-evaluations).

A current species list should be generated during project scoping prior to the development of the environmental document in order to identify potential species and/or designated critical habitat and support the initial effects determinations made for federally listed species and/or designated critical habitat.

Section 7 consultation and the preparation of the Biological Assessment typically occur between DED and FED. If the list generated prior to the DED milestone is older than 180 days, a new list will be required for inclusion in the DED. You will also need to verify the species list with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and/or National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) or update the species list if it is older than 180 days at the FED milestone. A species list also includes designated critical habitat within the project location and noting any revisions to critical habitat designations is also important. Chapter 4 of Volume 3 of the Standard Environmental Reference (SER), Section 4-2.2 will be updated to be consistent with this memorandum and will provide direction on requirements for developing the species list for each project.

Updates or verifications can be done in any of the following ways:

- Request a new list or verify an existing list in writing (informally/formally) from the Service(s).
