

Total Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Funding Announced for California

California has had **\$18.82 billion**ⁱ announced in Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) funding (formula and discretionary). Of this amount, **\$14.81**ⁱⁱ billion is dedicated to transportation-related projects, **\$3.80 billion**ⁱⁱⁱ is dedicated to clean energy, power, and environment projects, **\$176.54 million**^{iv} is dedicated to broadband projects, and **\$35.90 million**^v is for other projects.

Total Projects Funded with IIJA Funding

As of January 30, 2023, California has invested **\$3.25 billion**^{vi} in transportation projects.

Total Jobs Created

Since January 30, 2023, **42,308 jobs**^{vii} have been created in California.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise

From October 1, 2022, through March 31, 2023, Caltrans has awarded **24.74 percent** of contracts to Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. Our goal for Federal Fiscal Years 2022-2024 is **22.2 percent**.^{viii}

Investments in Disadvantaged Communities

As of October 4, 2022, a total of **\$3.76 billion** on 843 Active Transportation Program projects will benefit disadvantaged communities throughout California. Four of the 208 projects in Northern California, totaling **\$14.7 million**, are statewide initiatives, which support transportation partners across California to increase their opportunity to successfully deliver active transportation projects. Moreover, **93.8%** of Active Transportation Program project dollars (**\$3.76 billion out of \$4.0 billion**) benefit disadvantaged communities.^{ix}

Notable Grant Awards

On April 28, 2023, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) awarded \$21.8 million to 33 byway projects in 29 states, including five Tribal Lands. These are the first National Scenic Byways Program grants awarded since 2012. See the press release. California was awarded **\$4.5 million** for three projects, two went to Federally Recognized Tribes. Although this program received \$16 million from the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, and \$6 million from the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022, we want to highlight it in this section.

California has received almost **\$2.1 billion** in transportation discretionary grants for **300 projects**. This represents **12.35 percent** of the national total. Please find attached a supplementary spreadsheet for the data on California's grant awards we are presently tracking.

Note: The Rail Vehicle Replacement and Railroad Crossing Elimination awards will be announced soon.

Notable Highlights

- April 12 The USDOT's FHWA announced a <u>Request for Information</u> (RFI) seeking public input on environmental review processes that can be improved under the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). Comments are due by June 1, 2023. More information is <u>here</u>.
- April 21 The USDOT announced over 30 new commitments from organizations that are supporting the Department's <u>National</u> <u>Roadway Safety Strategy</u> and taking action to reverse the crisis that is killing more than 40,000 people on American roads each

- April 26 The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) is proposing new safety requirements to protect transit workers and riders. A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) is published <u>here</u>. Comments are due by June 26, 2023.

- <u>Advanced Transportation Technology and Innovation (ATTAIN)</u> This week ... Provides grants to deploy, install, and operate advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, mobility, efficiency, system performance, intermodal connectivity, and infrastructure return on investment.
- Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Opportunity (Mega, INFRA, and Rural) May 2023
 National Infrastructure Project Assistance Program (MEGA)
 - Provides grants to surface transportation infrastructure that are too large or complex for traditional funding programs that will have a significant national or regional impact.
 - <u>Nationally Significant Multimodal Freight and Highway Projects (INFRA)</u>
 Provides grants for multimodal freight and highway projects of national or regional significance.
 - <u>Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program</u>
 Provides grants for projects to improve and expand the surface transportation infrastructure in rural areas to increase connectivity, improve the safety and reliability of the movement of people and freight, and generate regional economic growth and improve quality of life.
- Ferry Service for Rural Communities Program; Passenger Ferry Boat Program May 2023 ... Capital and operating assistance for a ferry service that operated a regular schedule at any time during the five-year period ending March 1, 2020 and served not less than two rural areas located more than 50 sailing miles apart.
