# **CTC Updates**

#### ATP News

The ATP Quick-Build Project Pilot Program application closed on July 15, 2020. The Commission received 22 applications and released <u>staff recommendations</u> on September 15, 2020. The Commission will consider the staff recommendations and adopt a program of quick-build projects at the October 21-22, 2020 Commission meeting.

The 2021 Cycle 5 ATP application closed on September 15, 2020 and the log of received applications can be found on the <u>Caltrans</u> <u>website</u>. # **Caltrans Updates**

#### **Project Reporting**

CalSMART opened on October 1st for the Fiscal Year 20/21 quarter 1 reporting period. Progress reports are due October 15th. FY 19/20 quarters 3 & 4 progress will be presented at the October Commission meeting (October 21-22). Subscribe to the ATP reporting list-serve:

### Timely Use of Funds

The 2020 Interim Timely Use of Funds (ITUF) Policy adopted at the May CTC meeting will expire on December 31, 2020. Project components that are programmed in Fiscal Year 19/20 must allocate or receive a time extension by the December 2020 meeting. All time extension amendment requests due to COVID-19 must be on the December 2020 CTC Meeting. Allocation, time extension and amendment requests must be submitted to Caltrans by October 5th, 2020 to be included in the December CTC Meeting.

Project components that are programmed in Fiscal Year 20/21 must adhere to the current ATP guidelines as the ITUF Policy will expire on December 31, 2020. Projects with construction allocation beginning January 2021 will return to the current guidelines and have 6 months to award.

Programmed vs. Allocation Report will be shared with the TAC in early 2021 to include the allocations for Fiscal Year 19/20 that will conclude in December 2020.

# **ATRC Updates**

### ATRC NEEDS ASSESSMENT

#### UC Davis Benefit Cost Tool

UC Davis is tasked to develop a benefit cost tool for the Active Transportation Program. Earlier this summer UC Davis released a draft white paper of available studies and data that has been reviewed by Caltrans staff and the B/C Project TAC. The B/C Project TAC has also had their first three technical workshops to help make critical decisions for the direction of the tool. Once an ATP TAC meeting is planned in 2021, UC Davis will come present findings and tool progress.





### 2021 ATP Cycle 5 DAC TA

The ATRC has contracted with Local Government Commission (LGC) to perform the work of the DAC TA program. Through a detailed survey, LGC selected ten communities, including two tribes, to assist and provide technical assistance through the Cycle 5 application process. Continued assistance will be provided to the communities who were unable to apply this cycle so they can be best prepared for Cycle 6. We will share a final report and recommendations for a Cycle 6 DAC TA program at a future TAC meeting.

#### **Crossing Guard Training and Resources**

The ATRC has kicked off an update to the Crossing Guard guidebook and online training. Additionally, the ATRC will hold live train-the-trainer sessions. Stay tuned for the launch in 2021.

### Statewide Active Transportation Count Database

The ATRC is very close to having an executed contract with the Southern California Association of Governments to expand and improve upon their regional database to make it accessible for use by all in California. This innovative tool will be developed to facilitate the collection and storage of manual and automated bicycle, pedestrian, and other active user counts along with the creation of a final consistent statewide count methodology for active transportation projects.

# Other Items ·····

### California Walk Bike TAC (CWBTAC)

At the September meeting the CWBTAC discussed the following topics:

- Traffic Operations presented on their new draft Rumble Strip Guidelines, with special considerations for bicyclists
- Division of Transportation Planning presented their new Transportation Planning Scoping Information Sheet (TPSIS) which includes a section that tracks needs related to walking and biking prior to the development of the Project Initiation Document (PID)
- Design presented on their draft Complete Streets Waiver, which is a new document developed to help track inclusion/non-inclusion of bicycle and pedestrian needs through the project development through delivery phases
- Conversation on the new Racial Equity program at Caltrans, including current efforts within the Department

#### General Complete Streets Program Updates

Caltrans recently secured a one-time \$100M Reservation in the 2020 SHOPP to be dedicated to building meaningful and transformational bicycle and pedestrian projects. Caltrans continues to work on performance targets for Complete Streets in the 2021 SHSMP so that funding can be allocated to bicycle and pedestrian needs in the SHOPP

#### Caltrans Active Transportation (CAT) Plans

All districts are currently working on various phases of their CAT plans. Districts 4 and 5 will be releasing a draft of their plans for public review in early 2021. Public engagement efforts have been delayed due to COVID-19 and the fires, however, all districts are preparing to launch map-based surveys.
