- <sup>1</sup> The Locals' actual base Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2024-25 (FFY 2025) Obligation Authority (OA) is based on the updated amount provided by our Department's Office of Federal Resources (OFR) on October 6, 2025. The October 2024 through April 2025 reports reflected an estimated amount based on FFY 2024's final local OA amount until a full year of OA was issued by FHWA. The May report included the local OA amount provided by OFR on May 12, 2025, the June report was updated to include the local OA amount provided by OFR on June 27, 2025, and the July report was updated to include the local OA amount provided by OFR on August 5, 2025. The OFR's amount is based on the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) FFY 2025 OA Notice (FHWA N4520.289) dated April 30, 2025. The OA spread between regions and programs was updated based on the Department's Division of Financial Programming FFY 2025 Actual apportionment distributions issued on October 20, 2025.
- <sup>2</sup> Balance of FFY 2024 OA (last FFY's OA balance) -- This is the amount a Region/Program must pay back if over delivered or the amount a Region/Program will receive to "make whole" if under delivered based on the Division of Local Assistance's (DLA's) OA Management Policy. The excess PROTECT OA was redistributed and spread between regions/programs that received AR in FFY 2024. The PROTECT OA redistribution is based on the percentage of received FFY 2024 AR. The PROTECT OA was increased from \$5,000,000 to \$6,842,473 based on the actual local OA share amount from OFR dated October 6, 2025. The additional \$1,842,473 of OA will remaining with the PROTECT program in order to preserve OA delivery percentages.
- <sup>9</sup>The San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) and the Merced County Association of Governments (MCAG) entered into a transfer agreement dated January 24, 2025, for MCAG to transfer \$320,000 OA to SJCOG for the purpose of funding a ridesharing service. The same amount of CMAQ apportionment was also transferred and is reflected on SJCOG's and MCAG's Monthly CMAQ/STBGP Activity report.
- <sup>10</sup>In March 2025, \$30,000,000 of Local federal-aid Safety apportionments and OA were transferred to OFR per Reference 2.5h from the June 27-28, 2024 California Transportation Commission meeting, in exchange for State Highway Account (SHA) funds. The transfer and exchange is allowed per Senate Bill (SB) 137 (Chapter 639 of the 2019 Statutes), effective October 8, 2019, which authorized the Department to allow up to \$100,000,000 of federal Local Assistance funds to be exchanged for SHA funds. The purpose of the exchange is to fund local Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) projects with State and local funds. The exchange will lead to increased efficiency for local agencies by reducing the time and resources needed to deliver HSIP projects.
- <sup>11</sup>In September 2025, the CRP Adjusted FFY 2025 Actual OA was increased by \$9,058,000 due to repayment for three CRP FTA transfers that were processed in July 2025 and August 2025. The FTA transfers were for State projects and were processed with local CRP apportionments and OA. The \$9,058,000 of OA is being repaid to the locals from OFR.
