As required under 23 CFR 668.111(c), we request your consideration to approve Disaster CA23-3 February and March Winter Storms in Alameda, Alpine, Amador, Butte, Humboldt, El Dorado, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Kern, Lake, Los Angeles, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Modoc, Mono, Monterey, Napa, Nevada, Orange, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Francisco, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Shasta, Sierra, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Trinity, Tulare, Tuolumne, and Yuba counties as eligible under the Emergency Relief Program.

A Governor's Proclamation, including three supplemental Proclamations, executed March 1, 2023, March 8, 2023, March 14, 2023, and March 28, 2023, and a Presidential Emergency Declaration executed March 10, 2023, and a Presidential Disaster Declaration executed April 3, 2023, respectively, are included as part of the Disaster Survey Summary Report (DSSR), attached for your review.

The DSSR contains the latest list of identified damaged sites and their corresponding currently estimated repair costs. The preliminary damage estimate is in the range of \$164.18 million for State damages and \$30.54 million for Emergency Relief-eligible Local damages, subject to increase. The estimated federal share of repair costs on eligible roadways will be required to exceed the \$700,000 threshold per 23 CFR 668.105(j) as indicated in the attached Damage Survey Summary Report.

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As provided for in the FHWA Emergency Relief Manual, updated May 31, 2013, under Chapter III, Section A, Detailed Damage Inspections, the Detailed Damage Inspection Reports / Damage Assessment Forms (DDIR/DAF) "are completed at a later date, usually after the Division Administrator has made a finding of ER eligibility." FHWA's Acknowledgement letter dated March 8, 2023, for this disaster included that "all DAFs must be completed by June 30, 2023". Given the anticipated timeframe of a corresponding Finding of Eligibility and the necessary work to complete damage assessment, it is anticipated that additional time will be needed. Therefore, as part of this application the State of California formally requests the Damage Assessment Form due date be extended to August 30, 2023, in order to allow field staff to complete and submit DAFs to FHWA for approval.

Upon finding that the above Disaster is eligible, a Program of Projects will be developed and submitted to FHWA within 3 months of the Finding of Eligibility letter, as outlined in 23 CFR 668.13(a).
