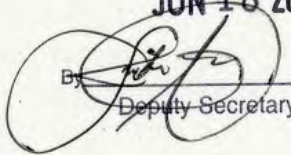

PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS between December 9, 2024, and December 18, 2024, the Franklin Fire ignited in Malibu Canyon in the City of Malibu, burning over 4,000 acres; and

WHEREAS high winds and red flag conditions increased the intensity and spread of the Franklin Fire, causing imminent threat to life and prompting evacuation orders for thousands; and

WHEREAS the Franklin Fire threatened structures, homes, and critical infrastructure, including 2,000 homes, multiple schools, and Highway 1; and

WHEREAS in response to a request from the Office of Emergency Services, on December 10, 2024, the Federal Emergency Management Agency approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant to assist with the mitigation, management, and control of the Franklin Fire; and

WHEREAS the Franklin Fire was followed by the devastating January 2025 Los Angeles County Fires and Windstorm Event, further impacting the emergency response and budgetary resources needed for local jurisdictions', including the City of Malibu; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8558(b), I find that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist due to impacts from the Franklin Fire in the City of Malibu; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8558(b), I find that the conditions caused by the Franklin Fire, by reason of their magnitude, are beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of any single local government and require the combined forces of a mutual aid region or regions to appropriately respond; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8625(c), I find that local authorities are inadequate to cope with the magnitude of the damage caused by the Franklin Fire; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with various statutes and regulations specified in this Proclamation would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of the Franklin Fire.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes, including the California Emergency Services Act, and in particular, Government Code section 8625, **HEREBY PROCLAIM A STATE OF EMERGENCY** to exist in the City of Malibu due to the Franklin Fire.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. All agencies of the state government utilize and employ state personnel, equipment, and facilities for the performance of any and all activities consistent with the direction of the Office of Emergency Services and the State Emergency Plan. Also, all residents are to obey the direction of emergency officials with regard to this emergency in order to protect their safety.

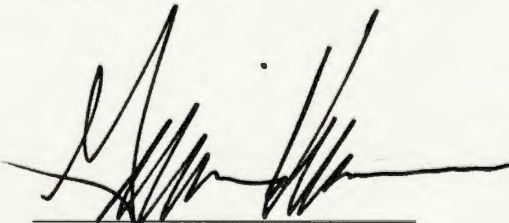
2. The Office of Emergency Services shall provide assistance to local governments, if appropriate, under the authority of the California Disaster Assistance Act, Government Code section 8680 et seq., and California Code of Regulations, Title 19, section 2900 et seq.
3. The restrictions set forth in Penal Code section 396, which are automatically triggered upon proclamation of a state of emergency, are suspended, and no such restrictions are imposed, with respect to the Franklin Fire in the City of Malibu.

I FURTHER DIRECT that as soon as hereafter possible, this Proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Proclamation.

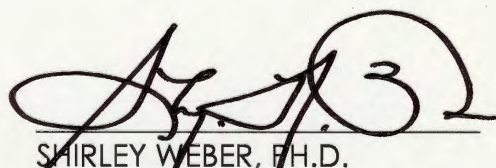
