


Distribution of Federal Gas Tax under FAST Act








California Federal-Aid Highway Program under FAST Act









This AGREEMENT, is entered into effective this ______ day of ______, 20 , by and between Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority, hereinafter referred to as "ADMINISTERING AGENCY," and the State of California, acting by and through its Department of Transportation (Caltrans), hereinafter referred to as "STATE", and together referred to as "PARTIES" or individually as a "PARTY."

- WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has enacted the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) of 1991 and subsequent Transportation Authorization Bills to fund transportation programs; and
- 2. WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California has enacted legislation by which certain federal-aid funds may be made available for use on local transportation related projects of public entities qualified to act as recipients of these federal-aid funds in accordance with the intent of federal law; and
- 3. WHEREAS, before federal funds will be made available for a specific program project, ADMINISTERING AGENCY and STATE are required to enter into an agreement to establish terms and conditions applicable to the ADMINISTERING AGENCY when receiving federal funds for a designated PROJECT facility and to the subsequent operation and maintenance of that completed facility.























Authorizations



- Authorize phase before work/advertising
- FHWA's approval to proceed with work
 - Preliminary Engineering (environmental and design)
 - Right of Way
 - Right of Way Utility Relocation
 - Construction
 - Construction Engineering
 - Non-Infrastructure
- Establishes date of reimbursement
- Do not authorize too soon or too late

How Do I Get My Project Funded?



- Is it adopted into the long range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)?
- Who should I contact for funding?
 - Bridge, Safety, ATP, Discretionary => Caltrans
 - STBGP, CMAQ, STIP, ATP => MPO/RTPA
- What is the Functional Classification?
- Is it on or off the Federal-aid system?



Selection By State



Bridge, Safety, ATP

- Caltrans issues Survey or Call for Projects
- Local agency submits applications for funding to Caltrans
- Caltrans reviews, verifies, and evaluates applications and then ranks them
- Caltrans provides approved project list to MPO/RTPA for programming into FTIP



Selection By MPO/RTPA

- MPO/RTPA issues Call for Projects





Individual Project Listing vs. Grouped Projects



- Individually Listed Projects
 - Programming phase(s) of a single project under one entry in the FTIP/FSTIP

Grouped Projects

- Projects grouped under a specified work function, work type, and/or geographical area
- Projects must be exempt from air quality conformity requirements
- Project phases are programmed under Construction
- Must have a detailed backup list of projects



Programming Changes



Formal Amendments

- Major changes to cost, scope, and schedule
- Adding or deleting a project/phase (except PE)
- Demonstrate financial constraint
- Requires public participation
- Federal approval
- Months

Administrative Modifications

- Minor changes to cost (40% or \$10M), project description, and limits
- Swapping funds (different color or type)
- State approves or delegates to MPO
- Days or weeks



Project Authorization



- Authorization to Proceed (E-76)
 - Before starting reimbursable work
 - Each project phase PE, ROW, CON
 - PE must move to ROW or CON in 10 years or repay funds
 - Must have approved LAPM 9-A/9-B (DBE) & 9-C (ADA) on file
 - Must have an executed Master Agreement
- Prepared by agency
- Cover letter and data sheets
- Include attachments for each phase

Construction Administration



- DOCUMENT, DOCUMENT!
- Standardized filing system
 - LAPM Chapter 16
 - Caltrans Construction Manual
- Prepare to be audited
- Makes for easier close-out and fewer claims
- Emphasize the need for pre-construction conference and partnering



Project Close Out



- All paperwork must be finalized and approved by the DLAE
- Final Report of Expenditures serves to document completion of construction, environmental mitigation measures, and acceptance of project by the local agency (Records retention clock starts after final payment is received from Caltrans.)
- FHWA must issue a final voucher
- Local Agency must maintain completed projects for inspections by Caltrans staff

Maintenance Requirements



- Title 23 USC Caltrans reviews maintenance
- Agency responsible for maintenance by agreement
- DLAE monitors maintenance annually
 - Checklist (LAPM 18-A)
 - Agency notified of any corrective actions
 - State may correct if agency fails to respond & costs deducted from future gas tax
- Caltrans Structures inspects local bridges every 2 years



Deficiencies & Sanctions



- Deficiencies Errors may lead to loss of funds depending on severity and circumstance
 - Procedural Deficiencies: Agency practices found unacceptable with required LAPM standards
 - Major Deficiencies: Process error that violates Federal or State law and must be corrected to prevent loss of funds
 - Unrecoverable Deficiencies (Federal Ineligibility
 Notification FIN): Major deficiency that violates Title 23 policies & cannot be corrected
- Sanctions Major and unrecoverable deficiencies require corrective action



Deficiencies & Sanctions



- Corrections Local Agency must implement an <u>Action Plan</u> to correct
- Results LAPM procedures may be modified to encourage quality control and careful planning
- Dispute Resolution Agency can appeal.
 Dispute resolution process listed in LAPM Chapter 20







 - SCO: 15 days
- Retention
 - 2% or \$40,000, whichever is greater

- HQ DLA reports inactivity to FHWA on a quarterly basis.


