**Question:**

What kind of GIS mapping are the Districts looking for?

**Answer:**

Regional maps, static maps, high level art maps. Data will be extracted by Caltrans. Plot maps that illustrate all the construction projects on different roadways. County map with jurisdiction, State Highway system roadways and plot CT projects in the different phases of development. Hyperlinks to real-time program documents. New thing trying to implement and share with local partners. It will not be hosted on the website because of challenges with ADA. It would be static. Create on-site, off-site location. Database based on Project initiation, based on phase, risks, schedule, costs. Caltrans will provide all the data from proprietary data bases, for example PRSM. Initially, it may be difficult to get database information to consultant, tying in consultant to retrieve data may be a little tricky, a hurdle to overcome, but it will be done. Which is why initially, data will be provided by D10 to the consultant.

D5 is a rural district and will do GIS mapping in-house. But D5 will be looking at what D10 does and what North Region has done. Interact with local partners by holding quarterly, 2-hour meetings with NPO's and give detailed updates on all CT projects. D5 has Cooperative Agreements with local partners projects.

D10 will provide data to consultant. Consultant to provide regional map, previously discussed. D10 staff will support Consultant with data provided.

Contract Scope of Work for GIS will need to be expanded.

D10 Public Information Officer will lead public outreach and not expect PPM Consultant to lead public outreach.
