## VII. Background:

	Outside of the information provided in the problem statement, I have included the definition of "self-help counties" that we wish to use for this study. "Self-help counties" will be defined using the definition provided by the Self-Help Counties Coalition which says that "[Self-Help Counties] deliver[] voter-approved (by super-majority) transportation sales tax measures that fund transit, highway, freight, bicycle, pedestrian and other transportation programs." By extension, the non-self-help counties are those counties that do not have access to these funding mechanisms and rely on alternative sources for revenue to fund their transit systems.
