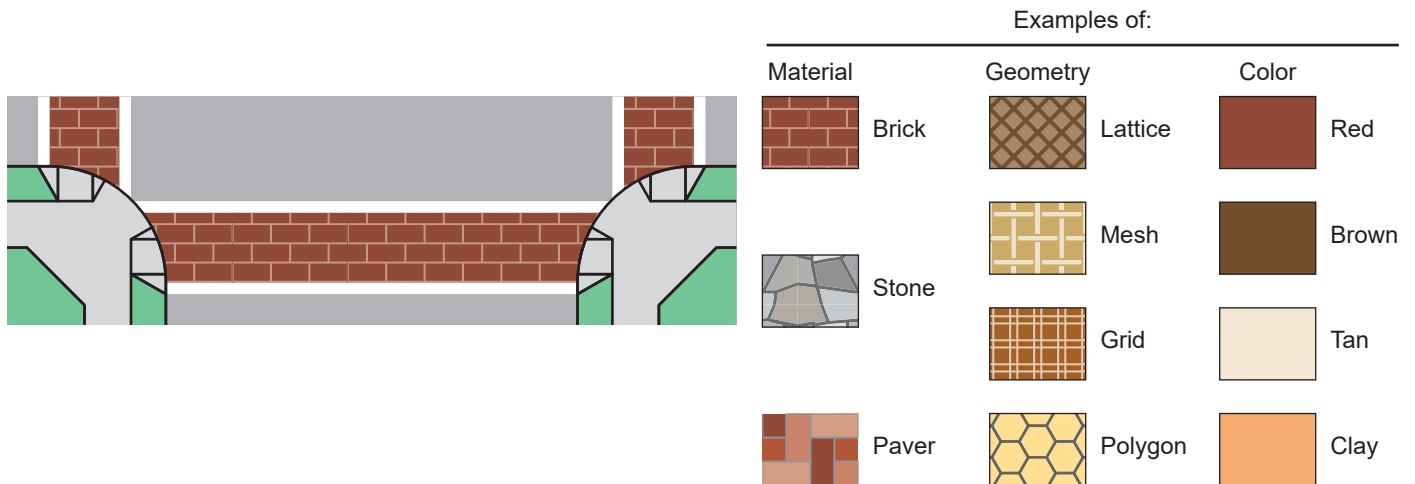
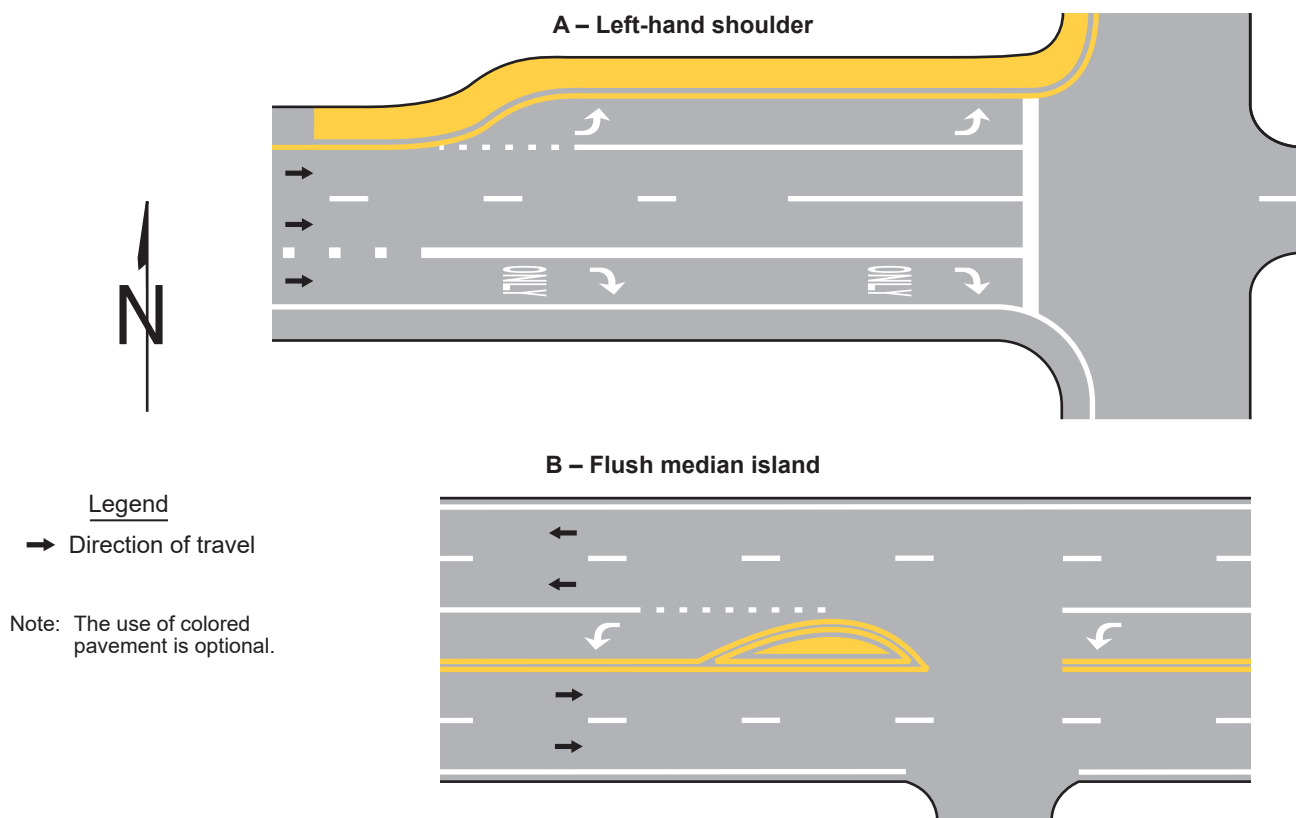


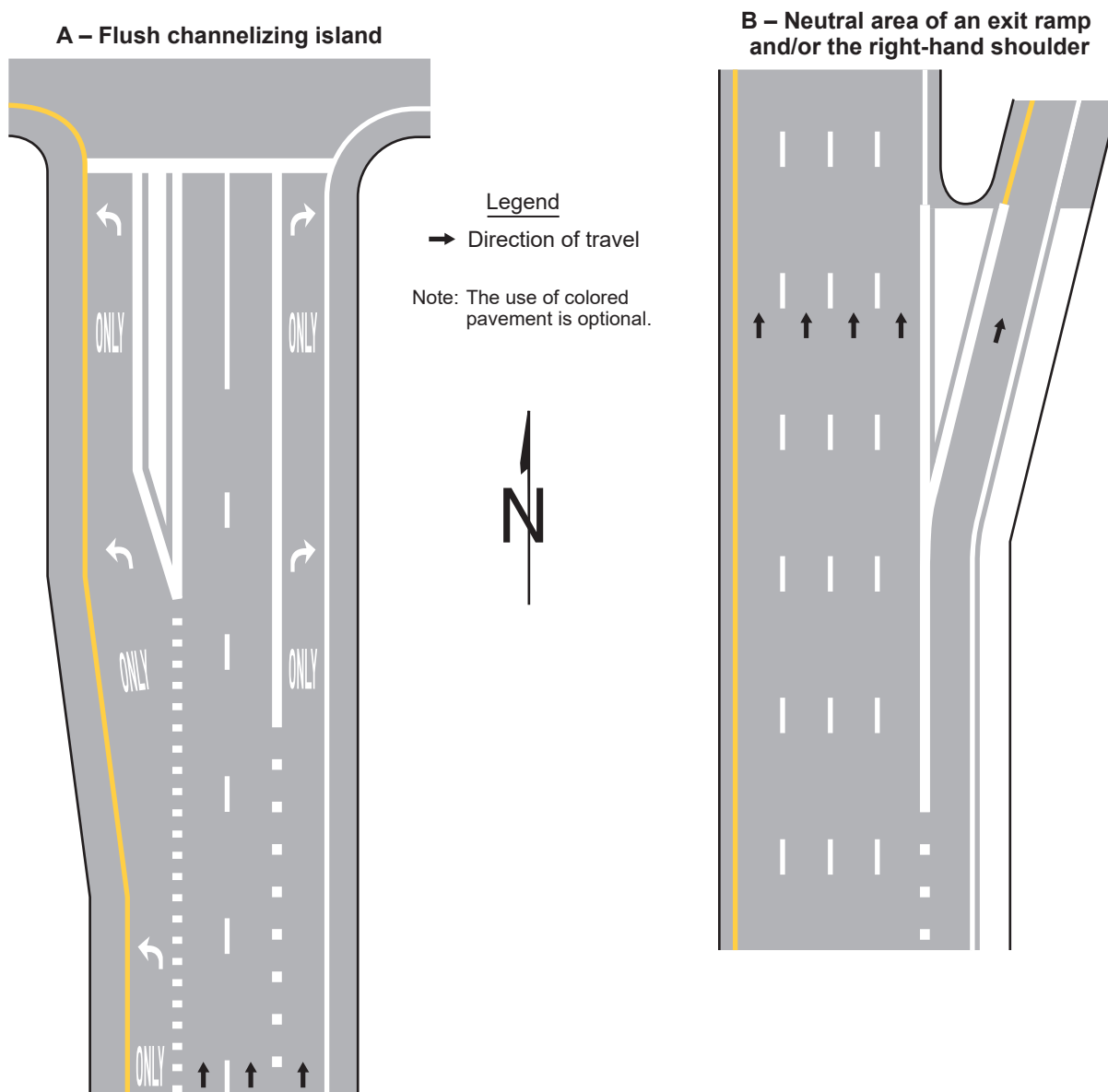
**Figure 3H-1. Aesthetic Treatments for Transverse Crosswalks**

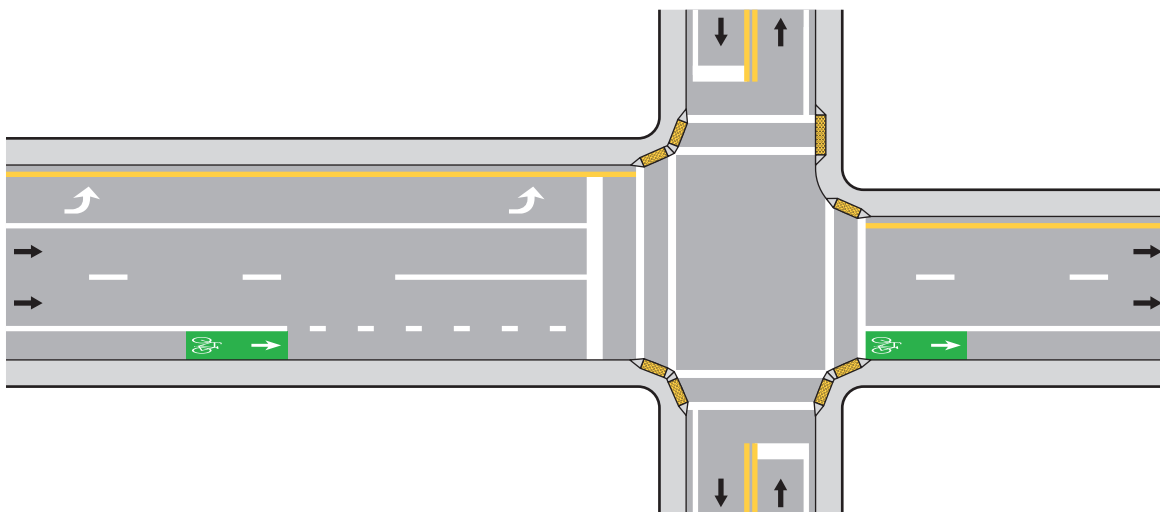

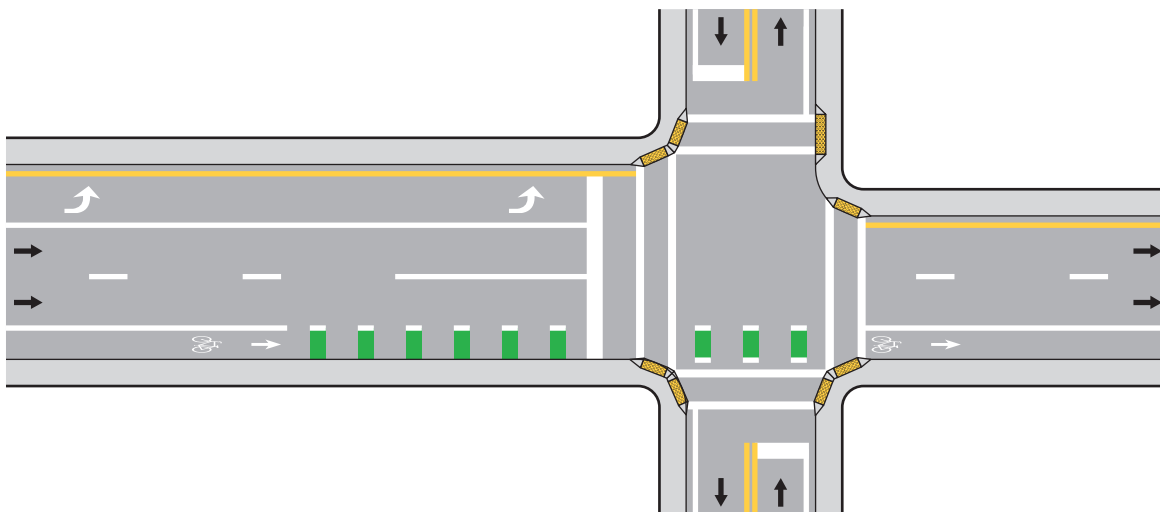

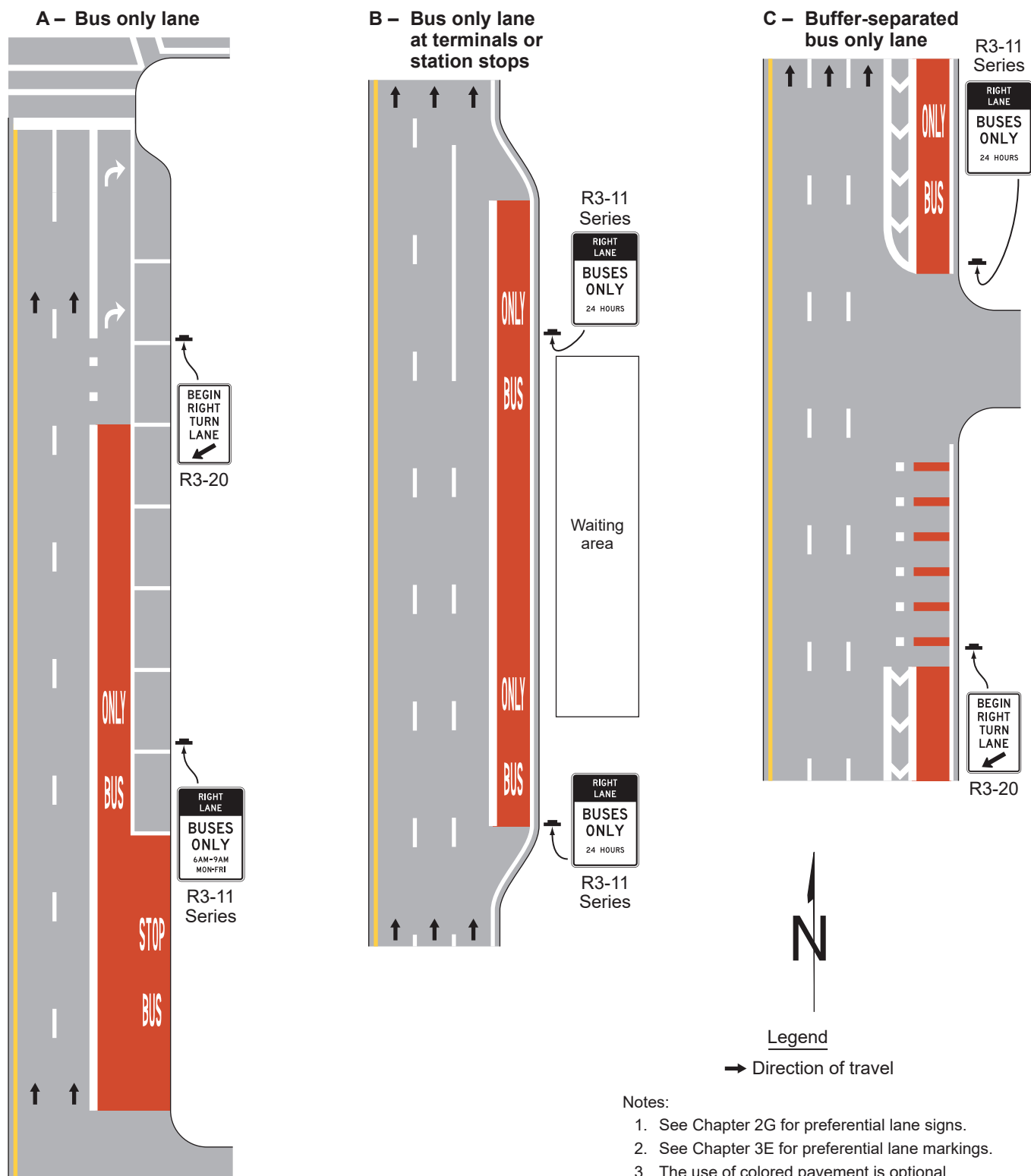

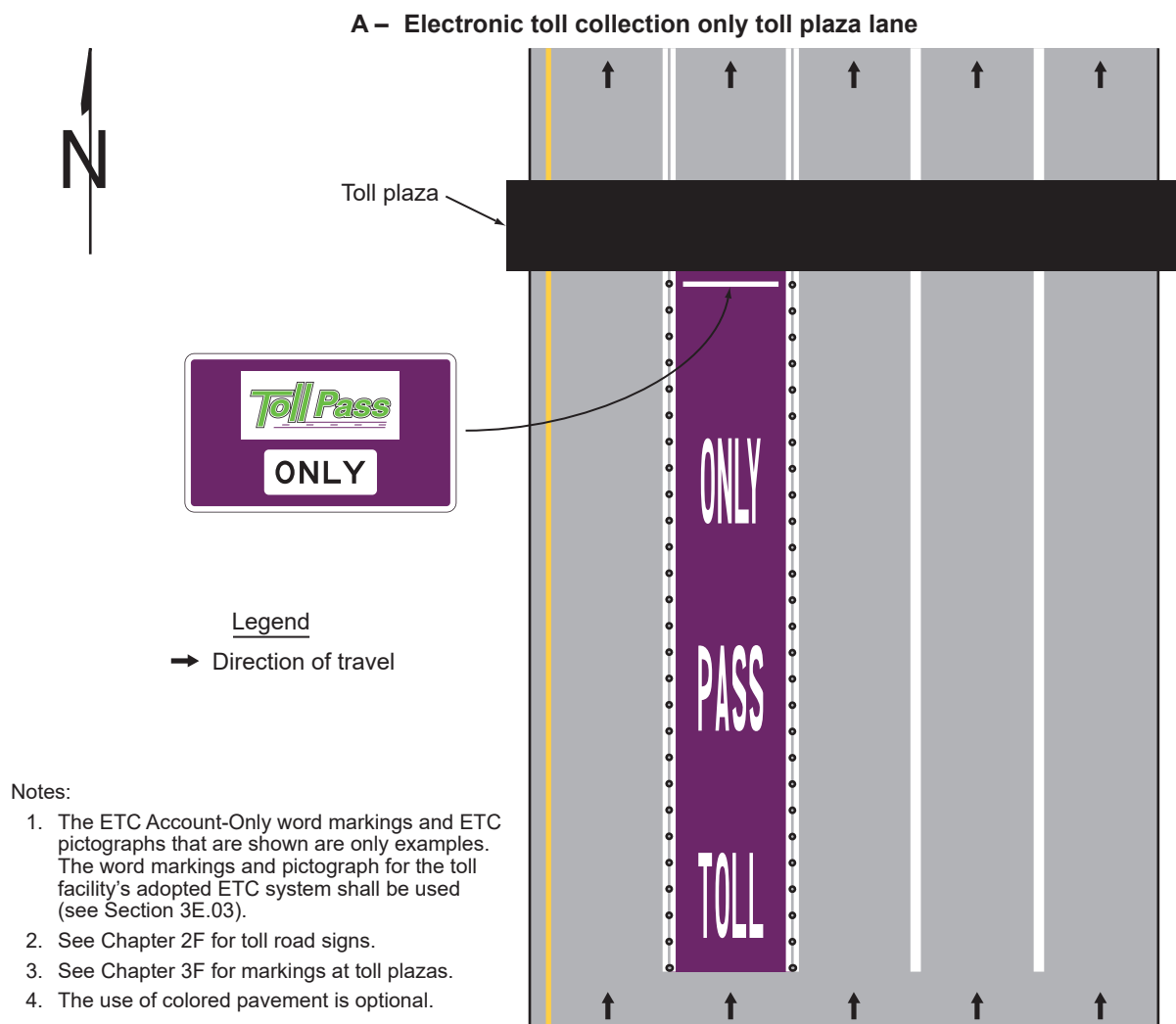

**Figure 3H-5. Examples of Red-Colored Pavement Applications**

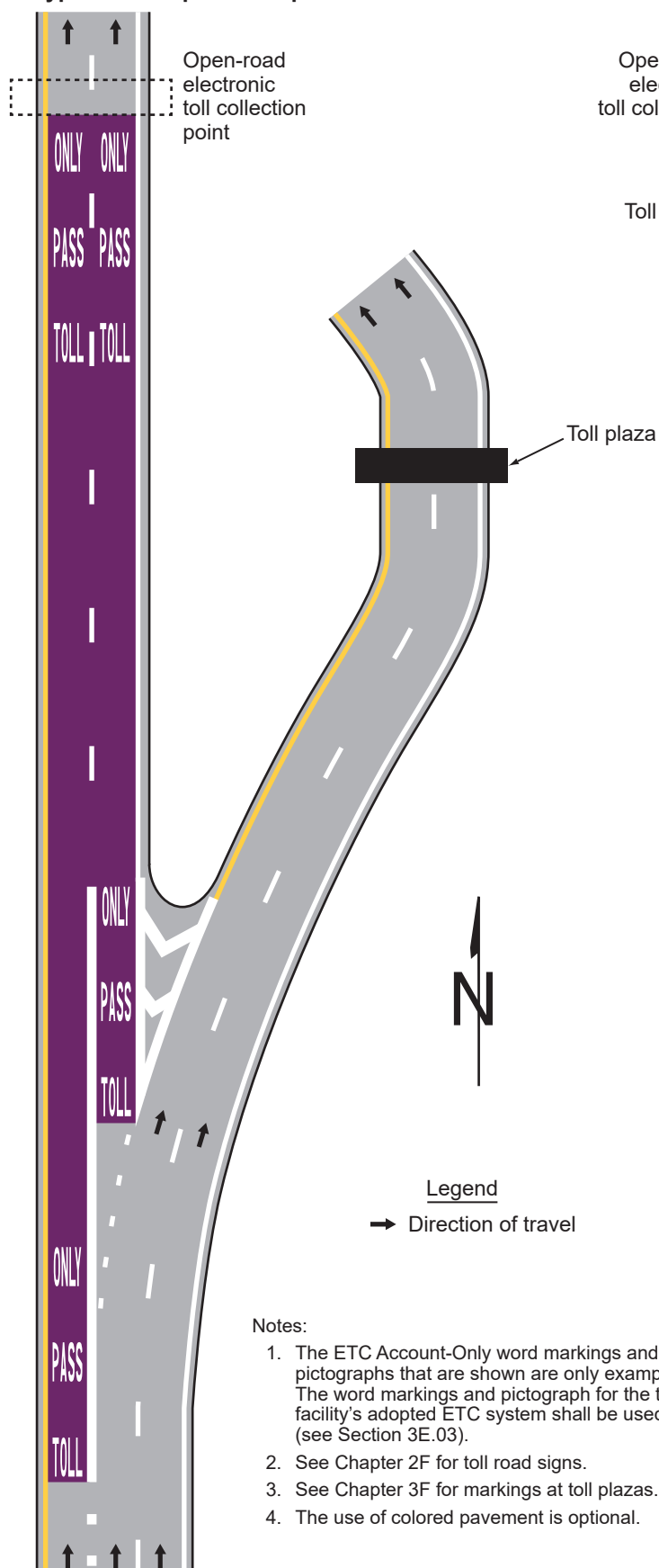


**Figure 3H-6. Examples of Purple-Colored Pavement Applications (Sheet 1 of 2)**
